LITURGICAL CALENDAR

The Order for the Celebration of Mass and of the Divine Office according to the General Roman Calendar for the Liturgical Year 2026, together with directives for the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton

The Sacraments

Infant Baptism

Parents are obliged to see that their infants are baptised within the first few weeks. As soon as possible after the birth, indeed even before it, they are to approach the Parish Priest to ask for the sacrament for their child, and to be themselves duly prepared for it (Canon 867 §1). For an infant to be baptised lawfully it is required: first, that the parents, or at least one of them, or the person who lawfully holds that place, give their consent; secondly, that there be a realistic hope that the child will be brought up in the Catholic religion. If such hope is truly lacking, the baptism is, in accordance with the provisions of particular law, to be deferred and the parents advised of the reason for this (Canon 868 §1).

The Reception of Infants and Children into Full Communion with the Catholic Church

Since the reception of Holy Communion in a Catholic Church does not, in itself, bring with it membership of the Catholic Church, validly baptised infants and children whose parents desire that they become Catholics, are to be received into full communion with the Church through an act of reception. Application for permission is to be made through the Chancery, and the reception is to be carefully recorded in the parish register of receptions.

Adult Baptism

The baptism of adults, at least of those who have completed their fourteenth year, is to be referred to the diocesan Bishop (Canon 863) through the Chancery.

The Reception of Adults into Full Communion with the Catholic Church and the Confirmation of previously-baptised Catholics

Application for permission to receive validly baptised Christians into full communion with the Catholic Church is to be made through the Chancery. For validity, a priest wishing to confer the sacrament of confirmation must have the faculty to do so, either from the universal law or by way of a special grant from the competent authority, issued through the Chancery.

Confirmation

The particular law of the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton requires that, ordinarily, candidates for confirmation be, at least, in their fifteenth year (school year ten).

Sunday Mass Obligation

The Church obliges the faithful to take part in the Divine Liturgy on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and, prepared by the sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), to receive the Blessed Eucharist at least once a year, if possible during the Easter season (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1389). If it is impossible to participate in the Eucharistic celebration, either because no sacred minister is available or for some other grave reason, the faithful are strongly recommended to take part in a liturgy of the word, if there be such in the parish church or some other sacred place, which is celebrated in accordance with the provisions laid down by the diocesan Bishop; or to spend an appropriate time in prayer, whether personally or as a family or, as occasion presents, in a group of families (Canon 1248 §2).

The Eucharistic Fast

Whoever is to receive the Blessed Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from all food and drink, with the sole exception of water and medicine (Canon 919 §1). The elderly and those who are suffering from some illness, as well as those who care for them, may receive the blessed Eucharist even if within the preceding hour they have consumed something (Canon 919 §3).

Veneration of the Most Blessed Eucharist

In churches or oratories which are allowed to reserve the blessed Eucharist, there may be exposition, either with the ciborium or with the monstrance, in accordance with the norms prescribed in the liturgical books (Canon 941 §1). It is recommended that in these churches or oratories, there is to be each year a solemn exposition of the blessed Sacrament for an appropriate time, even if it be not continuous, so that the local community may more attentively meditate on and adore the Eucharistic mystery. This exposition is to take place only if a fitting attendance of the faithful is foreseen, and the prescribed norms are observed (Canon 942).

Penance

According to the Church's command, 'after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year'. Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he experiences deep contrition, without having first received sacramental absolution, unless he has a grave reason for receiving Holy Communion and there is no possibility of going to confession. Children must go to the sacrament of Penance before receiving Holy Communion for the first time (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1457).

Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick 'is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. 'Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived' (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1514).

Marriage

It is the particular law of this Diocese that at least twelve months' notice be given to the Parish Priest before the date proposed for the marriage. This is to ensure adequate time for the preparation of the couple, as well as for the gathering and processing of the necessary documents.

Orders

Arundel & Brighton Vocations is the vocations service of the Diocese. It exists to help all men and women who are seeking to hear the call of God in their lives. The work of the vocations service focuses primarily around the promotion of priestly vocations and supporting men in the early stages of discernment for, and discovery of, the priesthood.

Sacred Times

Holy Days of Obligation

On Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass. They are also to abstain from such work or business that would inhibit the worship to be given to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, or the due relaxation of mind and body (Canon 1247).

Days of Penance

All Christ's faithful are obliged by divine law, each in his or her own way, to do penance. However, so that all may be joined together in a certain common practice of penance, days of penance are prescribed. On these days, Christ's faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, and to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the prescribed fasting and abstinence (Canon 1249). The days and times of penance for the universal Church are each Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent.

Abstinence from meat, as determined by the Bishop's Conference of England and Wales, is to be observed on all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (Canon 1251).

The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. The law of fasting binds those who have attained their majority, until the beginning of their sixtieth year (Canon 1252).

Friday Abstinence

In 2011, the Bishops of England and Wales re-established the practice of Friday penance in the lives of the faithful as a clear and distinctive mark of our Catholic identity, underlining, at the same time, the importance of a united, common act of Friday penance that is, in itself, an act of witness to the Crucified Lord. This corporate act of Friday penance should properly be fulfilled by abstaining from meat. Those who cannot or choose not to eat meat as part of their normal diet should abstain from some other food of which they regularly partake.

First Friday Prayers

The practice of pausing for prayer at 3pm on Fridays is a longstanding Catholic tradition. This was the time that Jesus died on the Cross. Prayer has been observed on the first Friday of every month since the Seventeenth Century when Jesus appeared to St Margaret Mary Alacoque and spoke to her of His Sacred Heart.

Our Diocese first published a call to public prayer every first Friday of the month in 2012. First Fridays provide a simple way to contribute to the mission of the Church and grow in our relationship with Jesus Christ, praying publicly during the day as an act of faith and public witness. We would like to invite all Catholics to pause for a moment of prayer, praise and thanksgiving at 3pm (or whenever you break for lunch).

Whatever you are doing and as your responsibilities allow, stop, perhaps close your eyes, bow your head and prayerfully and silently meditate on the sacrifice of love that Jesus made on the Cross. You may wish to make up a prayer of your own, thanking the Lord – “heart speaking to heart”, as Saint Cardinal Newman said. Or you might wish to say a favourite short prayer such as “We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the world”. The exact words used are not as important as pausing to be with Jesus in that moment, deepening your relationship with Him, and quietly and confidently being a witness of faith to those around you.

Special Collections

Special collections are taken up for various charities throughout the year. They are prescribed either by the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales or by the Diocese. There are also a few Voluntary Collections. The following notes give an indication as to how the money is applied.

Collections and Gift Aid

Please note that special collections marked "Gift Aid" may participate in the parish's envelope scheme. Other collections must make their own arrangements for Gift Aid (by, for instance, providing their own envelopes). If there is to be no missionary appeal, a collection for Overseas Missions should be taken on a Sunday between July and December.

Diocesan Collections (eligible for Gift Aid)

Education of Future Priests: With the need to pray for priestly vocations, there is also the necessity of providing for the training of priests at home and abroad to serve the Diocese of Arundel and Brighton.

Cathedral Maintenance: Arundel Cathedral is the mother church of the Diocese and the church of its chief pastor, the Bishop. The heavy expenses for its upkeep have to be shared by the parishes of the Diocese.

Retired Priests' Fund: To assist with the accommodation, welfare and support of diocesan priests in retirement.

Fund for the Missionary Endeavour of the Diocese: The Diocese has a continuing link with the Diocese of Chulucanas, Peru, supporting diocesan priests serving in missions and assisting students from missionary dioceses.

Lourdes Pilgrimage Fund: This is taken on the Sunday nearest the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes (11 February) in those parishes in which no appeal is made on behalf of the Lourdes Pilgrimage Fund.

National Collections

(Gift Aid is applicable only if using an envelope provided by the Charity)

Overseas Missions: If a parish is unable to have the designated missionary appeal for the year, this collection is made in its place and provides the people of a parish with the opportunity to help the missionary work of so many priests, religious, and lay people, and thereby be joined with the Church in spreading the message of the Gospel.

Lenten Alms: These are offerings which are given during Lent and usually placed in a box in the church for that purpose. The proceeds are sent to the contemplative orders of women in the Diocese.

Communications Day: This collection supports the work of the Catholic Communications Network, providing facilities and training for those working in the apostolate of the mass media.

Peter's Pence: By reason of the bond of unity and charity the Bishops of the Church with their people join together to produce those means which the Apostolic See needs to exercise its service of the Universal Church.

Stella Maris (formerly Apostleship of the Sea): Stella Maris provides pastoral care throughout the UK for seafarers.

National Catholic Fund Levy: The National Catholic Fund supplies the Bishops of England and Wales with the revenue necessary for the central administration of the Church in this country. A collection may be taken at any time when appropriate to offset the Levy.

Day for Life: The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, in response to St Pope John Paul II's Gospel of Life and the Bishops' teaching document Cherishing Life, set aside the last Sunday of July to celebrate and reflect on life-related issues. The collection, which may be Gift Aided, is distributed to charities associated with the theme.

World Mission Sunday (Missio): A collection for The Association for the Propagation of the Faith, one of the Pontifical Missionary Aid Societies, now called Missio.

Evangelii Gaudium Sunday: This is taken up on or near Evangelii Gaudium Sunday, the third Sunday of September. Formerly Home Mission Sunday.

Voluntary Collections

(Gift Aid is applicable only if using an envelope provided by the Charity)

The Catholic Association for Racial Justice (CARJ): This is taken up on Racial Justice Sunday, the Second Sunday of February.

CAFOD Fast Days: in Lent and at harvest time.

Catholic Education Service: This is the chief negotiating and advisory body on matters affecting all aspects of Catholic education.

Crib Collection: It is recommended that the Crib Collection should be donated to the Arundel and Brighton Crisis Fund c/o Catholic Children's Society (A&B Crisis Fund) 73 St Charles Square, London, W10 6EJ. Missio or the Friends of the Holy Land are also suitable beneficiaries for this collection.

Pax Christi: This is taken on Peace Sunday, the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time.

Liturgical Norms governing the manner of observing certain days in the Liturgical Year

Texts for Mass

This edition of the Liturgical Ordo includes, for each day, page numbers from the Roman Missal. On that page will be found additional indications (not included in the Ordo) for the celebration of Mass on the particular day. These additional directives indicate, for example, the page numbers for any Common texts which are to be used in the celebrations of the Saints and other Mysteries of the Faith, whether the Gloria and the Creed are to be included in the Mass, and other provisions (such as Solemn Blessings) suggested for the day in question.

Ranks of Celebrations

Celebrations, according to the importance assigned to them, are distinguished one from another and termed: Solemnity, Feast, Memorial. These distinctions are indicated in the Ordo by the abbreviations 'Sol', 'Feast' and 'Mem'. Optional Memorials may be used *ad libitum*.

Solemnities

Solemnities are counted among the most important days, whose celebration begins, ordinarily, with First Vespers (Evening Prayer I) on the preceding day. Some Solemnities are also endowed with their own Vigil Mass, which is to be used on the evening of the preceding day, if an evening Mass is celebrated. Solemnities include the Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus and Agnus Dei.

Feasts

Feasts are celebrated within the limits of the natural day; accordingly, they have no First Vespers (Evening Prayer I), except in the case of Feasts of the Lord that fall on a Sunday in Ordinary Time or in Christmas Time and which replace the Sunday Office.

Feasts (other than those celebrated on a Sunday, when the Creed is to be used) include the Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus and Agnus Dei.

Memorials

Memorials are either obligatory or optional. Their observance is integrated into the celebration of the occurring weekday in accordance with the norms set out in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal and of the Liturgy of the Hours.

Memorials include the Kyrie, Sanctus and Agnus Dei

Proper Celebrations

In this edition of the Ordo, there are no indications of Solemnities, Titles and Feasts proper to individual churches. Solemnities of Title are celebrated in accordance with I.4.c of the Table of Liturgical Precedence set out on pages 141 – 142 of the Roman Missal. Likewise, the anniversary of the dedication (consecration) of one's own church is celebrated as a local Solemnity in accordance with I.4.b of the same Table of Precedence.

Transferred Celebrations

For the pastoral good of the faithful, it is permitted to observe on Sundays in Ordinary Time those celebrations that fall during the week and that are agreeable to the devotion of the faithful, provided the celebrations rank above that Sunday in the Table of Liturgical Days (pages 141 – 142 of the Roman Missal). The Mass of such celebrations may be used at all the celebrations of Mass at which the people are present.

Ordo for Liturgical Celebrations in The Diocese of Arundel & Brighton for the Year of Our Lord 2026

Celebration of Parochial Feast Days

It should be noted that the anniversary of the consecration of a church and the feast day of the patron of a church are celebrated as Solemnities in their own right within their own parish. First Vespers and Sunday Compline should be said; Mass should have both Gloria and Creed and also two readings; if there are not already two provided, a second should be chosen from the appropriate Common.

Note also that these celebrations take precedence over most other days; only the Triduum, Holy Week, Easter Octave, Solemnities in the General Calendar, Sundays in Advent, Lent and Easter, Ash Wednesday and All Souls' Day take precedence over a parochial consecration anniversary or patronal feast. Should one of these occur, the parish celebration should be moved to the next day that is not listed above.

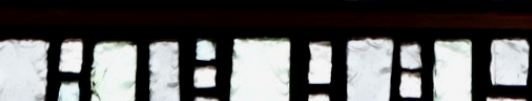
This means, for instance, that should a parish's patronal or anniversary celebration fall on a Sunday of the Year, then the celebration of the feast or anniversary takes precedence. Should the celebration fall on a Friday, the law of Abstinence does not apply in that parish.

If in any doubt, consult the Table of Liturgical Days on page 141 in the Missal.

It is also permitted to transfer a local celebration (such as patronal feast day, or anniversary of consecration) to a nearby Sunday (at all Masses, if desired) as long as the Sunday celebration does not outrank the local feast in the Table of Liturgical Days. See Missal p140, note 58.

Note also that on the anniversary of consecration, it is customary to have lit candles before the consecration stones around the walls at Mass. Mass texts should be taken from the Common for the Dedication of a Church 1091; readings (a first and second) are chosen from the Common, Blue Lectionary 931ff or Green 1239ff. Gloria and Creed are said or sung.
