# ELECTION OF DIOCESAN ADMINISTRATOR

In accordance with Canon Law (the laws and regulations that govern the life, organisation and mission of the Catholic Church), the diocesan College of Consultors — Monsignor Tony Barry, Fr Tony Bridson, Canon Jonathan Martin, Canon Kieron O'Brien, Fr David Osborne and Canon David Parmiter — met at The St Philip Howard Centre in Crawley on February 16 to elect a Diocesan Administrator to provide stability and continuity, and to serve and guide the faithful of the Diocese until a new bishop is appointed by the Holy Father.

Speaking on behalf of the College of Consultors, Monsignor Tony Barry said:

"We offer our prayers for Archbishop Richard as he begins his ministry in Westminster. While we await the appointment of a new bishop by Pope Leo XIV, and in accordance with Canon Law, we have today elected Canon Jonathan Martin as our Diocesan Administrator.

"Canon Jonathan has served our diocesan community with generosity and dedication for many years. His experience as a diocesan priest and Vicar General equips him ably to shepherd our parishes, schools and ministries. We ask the faithful to keep him, and all in the Diocese, in their prayers."

While no major decisions can be taken by the Administrator and College of Consultors which would affect the rights of a future bishop, the daily life and mission of the Diocese — its parishes, schools and diocesan offices — will continue steadily and faithfully in their care. Reflecting on his appointment, Canon Jonathan said:

"I accept this new responsibility with humility and trust in the Lord. I am sensible of the great confidence that the College of Consultors has placed in me, and of the responsibility of this new role in the service of the Diocese, in which I have been privileged to serve as a priest for the past thirty years. I look forward to working closely with the College of Consultors, with people across our parishes and schools, and with all those of good will, so that together we may continue to grow as communities of saints and as strong, lively and welcoming schools of discipleship, steadfast in our shared call to mission and commitment to the flourishing of the local Church."

## 2026 YEAR OF ST FRANCIS

**The special Jubilee Year of Saint Francis proclaimed by Pope Leo XIV will take place from 10 January 2026 to 10 January 2027, on the occasion of the eighth centenary of the death of Saint Francis of Assisi. The year highlights Francis's message of peace and care for creation.**

The Year of Saint Francis presents itself as a time of favour and grace, offered freely to all. As the Holy Father expresses his hope, may this jubilee awaken anew in hearts "feelings of Christian charity toward one's neighbour and an authentic desire for harmony and peace among peoples."

Eight centuries after his death, Saint Francis still calls the Church—and the world—to conversion. This Jubilee Year invites us not only to honour him, but to walk in his footsteps, rebuilding the Church through lives transformed by the Gospel.

**Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:  
where there is hatred, let me sow love;  
where there is injury, pardon;  
where there is doubt, faith;  
where there is despair, hope;  
where there is darkness, light;  
where there is sadness, joy.  
O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek  
to be consoled as to console,  
to be understood as to understand,  
to be loved as to love.  
For it is in giving that we receive,  
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,  
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.**

It is an ideal time to revisit the Canticle of the Sun, the teachings of Pope Francis in *Laudato Si* and to focus on the Catholic Social Teaching principle of Care for Creation. We also pray for those schools dedicated to St Francis, St Francis of Assisi, Crawley and St Francis, Caterham and for the Franciscan communities present in our diocese at Littlehampton, Ladywell and Rye.





Heavenly Father,  
In this sacred season that began on Ash Wednesday, we come before You with humble hearts. The ashes remind us that we are dust — fragile, dependent, and in need of Your mercy. Yet they also remind us that dust, when touched by Your grace, becomes holy ground.  
Lord, may this season not remain external.  
Do not allow it to be only a mark on our foreheads or words on our lips.  
Let it penetrate our desires.  
Let it purify our loves.  
Let it reorder our priorities.  
From dust... awaken humility within us.  
From decision... strengthen our will to choose You daily.

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# THE SPRING EASTER PROJECT

### **The Springs Easter Project leads pupils through a series of dance workshops that help them engage with the Easter story.**

Children will learn and create movement in response to the story. There is opportunity for spiritual development and the children will use their imaginations and creativity, growing empathy, self knowledge, self-esteem and self-confidence.

The workshops can culminate in an informal sharing or performance of the Easter story by the pupils, which can be shown to the school and parents through either a live or filmed presentation.

The project can be anything from one to six days, and can be split into workshops looking at different sections of the Easter story. For example:

- Palm Sunday
- Washing of the feet
- Last supper
- Garden of Gethsemane
- Trial
- Crucifixion
- Rolling away of the stone
- Mary at the Tomb
- Resurrection

The project can be adapted to suit the school.

Many schools choose to use the company one day a week leading up to Easter. Some schools prefer to fit the workshops into an intensive week or another format.

## ST CLEMENT'S, EWELL VISIT THE NATIONAL ST OSCAR ROMERO SHRINE AT ST GEORGE'S CATHEDRAL

**As part of our preparations for the Oscar Romero Award, Worship Leaders from St Clement's Catholic Primary School wanted to build on their knowledge of St Oscar Romero, whom they first encountered in Year 4. They were excited to discover that the National St Oscar Romero Shrine is in London, and a visit to St George's Cathedral in Southwark was arranged.**

The visit gave pupils the opportunity to learn more about St Oscar Romero's life and mission and to see his relics, including a fragment of the blood-stained vestment he wore when he was assassinated and his skullcap (zucchetto), displayed within a beautifully decorated Salvadoran-style reliquary cross. Our Head Girl and Head Boy lit a candle on behalf of the school.

Many pupils reflected that they arrived knowing only his name but left with a much deeper understanding of his courage, faith, and commitment to Catholic Social Teaching. They recognised how he stood up for people who were treated unfairly and spoke out for justice. One pupil commented that *"Oscar Romero was a bit like St Clement. He defended those who suffered injustice and stood up for what was right, even though it was dangerous."*

The children reflected that following Jesus means trusting that God will bring good from our actions and serving others with courage and love as true Agents of Change. The visit has inspired the Worship Leaders to share their learning with the whole school, and they are planning on leading an assembly on St Oscar Romero's feast day on March 24.

**Feast of St Oscar Romero**, one of the patron saints of Caritas Internationalis and patron saint of Caritas Social Action Network. Oscar Romero, the Archbishop of San Salvador, was assassinated while saying Mass on this day in 1980. He was a prophetic voice for justice and human dignity in El Salvador during the years of the military dictatorship. He embodies the preferential option for the poor. 



Following the success of the course this year, the Diocese of Arundel & Brighton and St Mary's University are delighted to announce the continuation of this professional qualification.

### Who is this course for?

- Secondary school teachers currently teaching RE outside their specialist subject.

### Course Highlights

- The award of a master's-level Postgraduate Certificate from St Mary's University (with optional MA progression).
- Access to M-level writing workshops and the full St Mary's online library.
- Subject knowledge enhancement aligned with next half-term's RED focus.
- Minimal cover impact: one full-day session in September plus six online twilight sessions.
- This year the course fee was £800 per participant, with hopes to keep costs similar for the upcoming year.

# CATHOLIC YOUNG WRITER AWARD 2026



**The theme for 2026 Catholic Young Writer Award is *The Church's Sacrament of Forgiveness: Why We Go to Confession*.**

[The Catholic Young Writer Award](#) for Catholic school pupils of secondary school age was launched by The Keys, the Catholic Writers Guild of England and Wales in the 1990s and has been flourishing ever since. It is now sponsored by the [Catholic Union Charitable Trust](#). The winners are invited to the Annual Meeting of the Catholic Union, held each Autumn in London, to receive their prizes from the President, Baroness Hollins.

Joanna Bogle of the Keys, the Catholic Writers Guild of England and Wales says:

“ There has been something of a revival in the Sacrament of Reconciliation – confession of sins and receiving absolution from a priest – in recent years. Young people, in particular, have been discovering a fresh understanding of this Sacrament, and at large gatherings such as World Youth Day, large numbers of priests are available for the thousands who wish to go to confession and receive God's forgiveness. Why we go to confession is a fascinating topic and I am looking forward to hearing the views of students.

Notes to entrants:

- Write an essay that answers this question, Why Do We Go to Confession? Your essay, no more than 1,200 words, should include specific references to Scripture, including Christ giving authority to His Apostles to forgive sins in His name, to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, and to relevant Papal documents, including Pope St John Paul's *Reconciliatio et Paenitentia* (1984).
- The Award is open to all young Catholics (and pupils at Catholic schools) in England and Wales in secondary years 8-11 inclusive. There is a cash prize for the best essay, plus a number of runner-up book prizes.
- Essays should be handwritten if possible.


## SSP events - Lent, Holy Week and beyond

**Testimony 360 is a free digital education programme from the Holocaust Educational Trust that combines digital eyewitness testimony with virtual reality, revolutionising access to survivor testimony and providing an invaluable opportunity for students learning about the Holocaust.**

As the Holocaust, the murder of six million Jewish people, moves from living memory into history, we must make sure this seismic event remains present in our national consciousness.

Testimony 360 allows students to ask their own questions of Holocaust survivors via pre-recorded interactive testimonies, and by using virtual reality, they will explore the recordings of historical sites associated with the Holocaust – all without leaving their classroom.


## Every Child Achieving and Thriving (DfE White Paper)

Published on 23 February 2026, the Department for Education's "Every Child Achieving and Thriving" White Paper outlines a ten-year strategy focused on integrating high academic standards with a "mainstream-first" approach to inclusion. Key reforms include a £4 billion investment to restructure SEND support, the requirement for all schools to join multi-academy trusts, and initiatives to halve the disadvantage gap. The government has set out a long-term plan to ensure every child—particularly those with SEND—achieves strong outcomes and thrives. It focuses on inclusion, early intervention, workforce capacity, and system reform.

In the coming months we will be working with the CES, the DfE, Local Authorities, Bosco and Xavier CETs and schools to understand the implications for our sector and the actions we will need to prioritise.

## Parental complaints

A new guide which aims to help parents work with schools to address complaints in a positive and respectful way has been published by the DfE, the charity Parentkind, and Ofsted. Parents are advised against using social media to air their complaint, and told to avoid behaving aggressively, targeting people, or "building a crowd" around their concern.

We hope that a clear set of ground rules will help to ease the pressure on schools of vexatious and personalised complaints and support the good and productive relationships with parents we all want to see.

Rachel has been a driving force in Brighton's move towards healthier, smartphone-free childhoods.

- First school in Brighton & Hove to urge parents to delay smartphones, backed by clear, consistent communication through school newsletters.
- Helped ignite a city-wide movement by hosting a pivotal SFC Brighton panel event in January this year.
- Worked with SFC Brighton to draft a letter to Year 6 families at primary schools across the city, cosigned by all 10 secondaries in the area, stating that no smartphones would be needed to attend secondary school.
- Presented to Brighton & Hove Council leaders, which resulted in them writing to every family in the region urging them to delay smartphones until 14.
- Introduced a fully smartphone-free policy in September 2025, and supported other heads across the city, creating a genuine domino effect with many primaries following suit.
- Launched Year 6 smartphone-free ambassadors – with 17 pupils applying this year – and brought in local Year 10 student leaders to present to the whole school about the risks around smartphones.

The DfE have published the 'Education Estates Strategy: a decade of national renewal'. A link to the document can be found here: [Education Estates Strategy: a decade of national renewal](#)

The DfE has provided a summary narrative for circulation and we would also draw your attention to the helpful timeline in Annex A of the strategy document. There are a number of areas in the narrative worth highlighting:

## Manage the Estate

- A new digital service *Manage Your Education Estate* will be launched later this month. This is intended to provide easier access to guidance, tools and data and it will be accessed by logging on with a DfE sign-in account.
- The DfE refers to a new requirement for "light touch" self-assessment returns by responsible bodies (which includes dioceses) on whether the School Estates Management Standards are being met, this will be introduced from autumn 2026.
- There is to be a new approach to collection of condition data, and the document refers to two-way data sharing being introduced by 2028.
- The DfE will be working with the sector to develop a decision-making framework to better utilise surplus land and buildings by autumn 2026. We have yet to establish how this will work in a diocesan context.

## Improve and Renew the Estate

- A new programme to replace the Condition Improvement Fund (CIF) will be introduced from 2028.
- There will be a new renewal and refit programme, the DfE stated aim in relation to which is to improve condition and increase resilience to climate change. This new programme will be piloted in schools in the East Midlands, Yorkshire and the Humber and the Southeast from April 2026, will be expanded from 2027, being national by 2029. New guidance will be published in February 2026 to support schools and colleges in delivering their own renewal projects.
- There is an emphasis in the narrative and the strategy document on adapting the estate to be more inclusive and accessible for children and young people with SEND.

- There will also be support for digital connectivity and climate resilience.

## Build and rebuild

- The School Rebuilding Programme is to be expanded with the addition of a further 250 schools and sixth form colleges by spring 2027. The diocese, working with our Catholic Education Trusts, will look to nominate some of our schools for this programme.
- New design specifications have been published, and I will provide more information when this becomes available.
- Both the narrative document and the strategy document include references to a focus on the provision of school-based nursery places and SEND provision.

This is a significant area of new policy and additional guidance from the DfE and Ray Williamson will signpost you towards any additional training and information and this will also be picked up in future SBM Forum gatherings.

- 2 March 2026** Deadline by which the Diocese must receive a copy of your determined admission policy and SIF **E: [tamsin.connick@abdiocese.org.uk](mailto:tamsin.connick@abdiocese.org.uk)**
- 15 March 2026** Deadline for admission authorities to send a copy of their full determined admission arrangements to their local authority and publish those arrangements on the school's website.
- 15 May 2026** The deadline for objections to be submitted to the Schools Adjudicator on any admission arrangements.

Schools must also ensure that a full record of consultation and policy determination is kept as part of the admission process for 2027/28.

May we also remind all schools that they should update their websites to remove any reference to consultation and the draft policies now they have been approved. There should also be no arrangements displayed for years prior to 2025/26 as these are no longer relevant.

- Only a small number of schools will be using the Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP) -these are the schools which are totally oversubscribed with Catholic applications only – possibly 8 schools.


