Introduction

The government's Schools White Paper, [Every Child Achieving and Thriving](#), committed to strengthening support for children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), including the development of high-quality training materials to support schools and post-16 settings.

The Department for Education (DfE) has now published the first set of SEND In-House Training Materials, designed to help settings strengthen inclusive practice, support staff development and reduce the time needed to develop training materials locally. Further materials will be published throughout the academic year.

These free DfE materials have been informed by Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) guidance and developed by Ambition Institute to support SEND professional development in schools and post-16 settings.

Why have these materials been developed?

Helping schools and post-16 settings strengthen inclusive practice and deliver effective staff development

Many schools and post-16 settings already provide training on SEND and inclusion. The SEND In-House Training Materials have been developed to support that work by providing free, editable resources that leaders can use and adapt within their own setting.

The training package aims to support staff to:



Build confidence and expertise in inclusive teaching practices



Create positive, supportive and inclusive learning environments



Understand and effectively respond to individual needs

Free, editable resources containing practical strategies and tools to help schools and post-16 settings strengthen inclusive practice and reduce planning workload.

How do the materials work?

Flexible resources designed for use within schools and post-16 settings

The materials are designed to support leaders, including SENCOs, inclusion leads and those responsible for professional development, to deliver SEND and inclusion training that meets the needs of their own setting. They can be used within existing staff development programmes and adapted to local priorities and contexts.

- **How can settings use the materials?**
 - During INSET days, staff meetings, team meetings and twilight sessions.
 - As part of planned professional development programmes.
 - To train teachers, leaders, teaching assistants and support staff.
 - Alongside existing SEND and inclusion activity.
- **What's included?** The package includes:
 - Structured, editable training sessions and facilitator guidance
 - Knowledge-building resources and reflection activities
 - Support for planning professional development
 - Practical examples, case studies and exemplification
- **What is the publication schedule?** Currently available:
 - Guidance on how to use the materials
 - Introduction to SEND reform and inclusive teaching
 - Introduction to Areas of Development
 - Speech, Language and Communication Development materials
- **Additional materials will be published throughout the academic year.**
 - Additional Areas of Development
 - Inclusive teaching resources
 - Case studies and exemplification
 - Tools for planning and evaluating professional development

Schools and post-16 settings can use the materials flexibly to support professional development, strengthen inclusive practice and meet local workforce needs.

Why schools and post-16 settings may find these materials useful

Free, evidence-informed DfE materials designed to help schools and post-16 settings deliver high-quality SEND and inclusion professional development that supports staff, strengthens practice and benefits pupils and learners.

Save time

- Free, editable resources reduce the need to create SEND training materials from scratch where settings were already planning to deliver CPD.

Build staff confidence

- Supports staff to develop a stronger understanding of SEND, inclusion and how to support children and young people with different needs.

Create a shared approach

- Helps leaders, teachers, teaching assistants and support staff develop a common understanding of inclusive practice across the setting.

Turn learning into action

- Combines knowledge with practical examples, reflection activities and opportunities to consider how approaches can be applied within individual settings.

Support effective professional development

- Designed to help leaders move beyond one-off training sessions and support learning that is embedded and sustained over time.

Flexible and relevant

- Resources can be adapted to local contexts and used alongside existing school improvement activities or post-16 quality improvement approaches.

Support day-to-day practice

- Provides practical strategies, tools and examples that staff can consider and adapt to support all learners, and especially learners with SEND.

Flexible and practical support that schools and post-16 settings can adapt to their own context.

What's available now?

Available from Friday 25 September 2026

The first set of materials is designed to help schools and post-16 settings build staff understanding of the proposed SEND reforms and inclusive practice.

Included in September publication:

- Introduction to SEND reform
- Introduction to Inclusive Teaching
- Introduction to Areas of Development
- Speech, Language and Communication Development materials
- Overall planning guide for leaders, and facilitator guidance for each session

Further materials are planned for January 2027 and April 2027. Details will be added once content and timings are confirmed:

- Deeper dives into additional Areas of Development
- Spotlights on inclusive teaching strategies
- Case studies
- Tools for planning and evaluating professional development
- Further practical guidance and exemplification

The training materials provide practical professional development support during the 2026 to 2027 academic year. References to proposed SEND reforms and Areas of Development remain subject to final policy decisions.

New SEND and Inclusion Training Materials Now Available

The Department for Education has published the first set of SEND In-House Training Materials to support schools and post-16 settings in delivering professional development on SEND and inclusion. The training materials form part of the government's wider commitment to strengthening support for children and young people with SEND and are designed to help settings build staff knowledge, confidence and understanding of inclusive practice.

The free, editable materials include structured training content, facilitator guidance, practical strategies and activities for discussion and reflection. They are designed to reduce the time needed to develop training materials locally and leaders can tailor them to their setting and use them during INSET days, staff meetings, staff development days and wider professional development programmes. Developed by Ambition Institute for DfE, the materials complement other SEND professional development opportunities, including the NPQ for SENCOs.

This first set of materials covers:

- Introduction to proposed SEND reforms and inclusive teaching
- Introduction to Areas of Development
- Speech, Language and Communication Development
- Supporting guidance for leaders and facilitators
