Home - Auckland

Continuing north, we head into the **Town Basin** of Whangarei. Here we have the chance to take in the thriving atmosphere as you have some free time to explore the many shops and galleries, and also view one of the largest and most historically significant collections of clocks in the Southern Hemisphere at Claphams Clock Museum or visit the Hunderwasser Centre.

If time permits we will view the majestic 26m high classic curtain **Whangarei Waterfalls** before the final leg into Paihia where we will be based for the next four nights. After you are settled in, we meet for **dinner** at the great onsite restaurant and enjoy a lovely meal together getting excited about the coming days adventures!

DAY 5

Fri 20th March

Paihia (Bay of Islands)



A relaxed start to the day before boarding the coach for a local sightseeing day out. Our first stop is just down the road where we visit the award-winning national attraction, **Waitangi Treaty Grounds**. This morning we will enjoy an authentic and interactive cultural experience as we have a private guided tour of the grounds. Also there will be some free time to explore the Treaty House, museum and view short films.



We have a great **picnic lunch** lined up before we then travel the back roads which will see us pass the **Haruru Falls** before arriving in **Kawakawa**.

As a group we then take a journey on the Bay of Islands **Vintage Railway.** This is unique in the world as it is the only working railway where the train travels down the middle of a State Highway and right through the middle of the town. The railway at Kawakawa was the North Island's first railway to be opened and the first to run a rail passenger service in the North Island.

You will also have the chance to visit the world famous **Hundertwasser toilets**, designed especially by the town's famous Austrian resident, Freidensreich Hundertwasser.

Back on the coach we have a short drive south to Waiomio and visit the **Kawiti Glowworm Caves**, Northlands ultimate glowworm experience. Our guided tour will follow a wooden boardwalk through a 200 metre limestone cave system. Once inside, you will see thousands of glowworms spread across the ceiling surrounded by breathtaking stalactites and stalagmites.

It is then time to head back to our hotel to get ready for our special group dinner cruise tonight. We will enjoy a leisurely 2½ hour cruise up the Waitangi River to the gorgeous Haruru Falls while enjoying delicious cuisine. Marvel in the tranquil surroundings with a rich abundance of bird life and historical points of interest, raising a glass to our exceptional time in the Bay of Islands.

Sat 21st March

Paihia - Taipa



Today it is time to depart the Bay of Islands and carry on exploring the Far North. Stop in at NZ's oldest house in Kerikeri before we head north to visit one of the region's most fascinating heritage tourism destinations at **Butler Point**. We will be treated to a great tour which includes the Whaling Museum, one of the most comprehensive private museums of its kind in New Zealand. Also, Butler House, which is a nationally significant heritage building and the gardens which are recognised as a 'Garden of Significance'. **Morning tea** provided.

After this great visit we carry on and travel up to the beautiful **Karikari Peninsula**, which is renowned for its amazing white sandy beaches and bays such as popular Maitai Bay.

We have an outstanding lunch organised at New Zealand's northernmost vineyard and winery, **Karikari Estate.** Overlooking the rolling coastal land, towards the very top of the far north, we will also enjoy a **wine tasting** if you wish.

This afternoon we explore more of this picturesque area and visit a few lovely spots before checking into our beach front accommodation. Tonight we **dine at the onsite restaurant** enjoying the views while watching the sun go down.

Sun 22nd March **Taipa - Matakana**



We wake up in paradise and enjoy another delicious breakfast, We depart the peninsula and head south west to the **Hokianga Harbour**. We arrive at Kohukohu on the north side and catch the **vehicle ferry** over the harbour to Rawene, before heading up the harbour with the first stop at Opononi. This picturesque place was made famous in the summer of 1955 and 1956 due to the exploits of a dolphin called Opo. We park up next to the statue of Opo for photo opportunities while taking in the magnificent views.

Then we start making our way south into the majestic Waipoua Forest, which preserves some of the best examples of kauri forest remaining in New Zealand. We stop and visit the one and only **Tana Mahuta** "Lord of the Forest" which is a giant Kauri tree estimated to be between 1,250 and 2,500 years. It is the largest kauri known to stand today and a truly spiritual experience.



After being enchanted by this special area we are back on the road passing through Dargaville and onto Matakohe. Here we visit the award-winning **Kauri Museum**, which tells the story of our pioneering settlers through the lens of the Kauri Industry. We will be greeted with a warm welcome and an introduction to the museum which has many exhibits that tell the story of the pioneering days when early European settlers in the area extracted kauri timber and kauri gum. **Lunch on-site**.

We then hit the road reconnecting with SH1 before turning off again headed for the quaint little town of Matakana.

We have a superb **dinner** lined up where we'll celebrate our final night together..

After breakfast and to really make our final day special we board the coach and head north to Sandspit to join the largest **mail run** by water in the Southern Hemisphere.



From the comfort of a large and luxurious ferry you will have uninterrupted 180-degree views of this scenic wonderland and historic landmarks, while your experienced and informative skipper guides you around over 75 different wharves, delivering freight and mail to the island residents.

Lunch today is a classic **Kiwi BBQ** onboard while cruising to our stopover on **Kawau Island.** Here you can visit **Mansion House Museum**, Sir Governor Greys Garden of Eden, or take one of the many walks to historic sites whilst watching Kawau's wildlife.

It is then back to Sandspit and board the coach and make our way to Auckland airport where you'll hop on the plane and **fly** directly home hopefully with some magnificent views of Mt Ruapehu and Taranaki. Our coach will be there waiting to transfer you back to the racecourse.
