## **Cell Phones: A Double-Edged Sword**

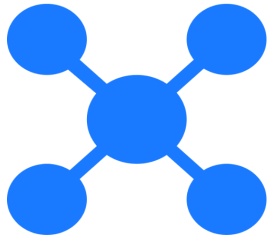

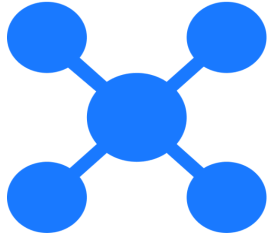
## **Disadvantages of Cellphones:**
