Country N° 71: MALI



Six-year-old Djariettou "Jaja" Fade made history as Save a Child's Heart's first patient from Mali, becoming the 71st country reached by the organization when she traveled to Israel to undergo life-saving open-heart surgery in December 2024. Djariettou dreams of becoming a doctor herself one day.

Country N° 72: VENEZUELA



Emmanuel Alejandro was born in Venezuela and became the first child from his country to receive care through Save a Child's Heart, marking Venezuela as the 72nd country reached by the organization.

His journey to lifesaving surgery in Italy, where he was operated at the Cardiochirurgia Pediatrica Sicilia – Centro Cardiologico Pediatrico del Mediterraneo (CCPM), was made possible through a unique and powerful international collaboration between Save a Child's Heart and Dr. Sasha Agati, Head of the Congenital Heart Academy, proudly highlighted by the Israeli Embassy in Italy.

JOB & CHRISTINE: TWO SIBLINGS, ONE CONDITION

Job, 16, and his five-year-old sister Christine, both diagnosed with the same congenital heart defect during a Save a Child's Heart medical mission to South Sudan, traveled in February 2024 to Israel with their mother for life-saving cardiac procedures at the Wolfson Medical Center. After successful treatments—Christine undergoing open-heart surgery and Job receiving two critical catheterizations—these siblings have returned home with renewed health and vibrant futures ahead, Job eager to play football without fatigue and pursue his dream of becoming an engineer.

ONCE A SACH PATIENT ALWAYS A SACH PATIENT

Ashura (38, left) and Asha (37, right) first met in 2002 at the Children's Home in Israel, where they received life-saving heart surgery through Save a Child's Heart.

In 2024, both women returned to Israel for follow-up procedures, more than two decades after their first journey.

When they saw each other again at the SACH house, they instantly recognized one another from childhood and reconnected like no time had passed.

Today, Ashura is a procurement officer and mother of three. Asha works in government.

Their journey, from Zanzibar to Israel and back, is a beautiful reminder of how SACH gives children a second chance at life—and sometimes, a second chance at friendship too.

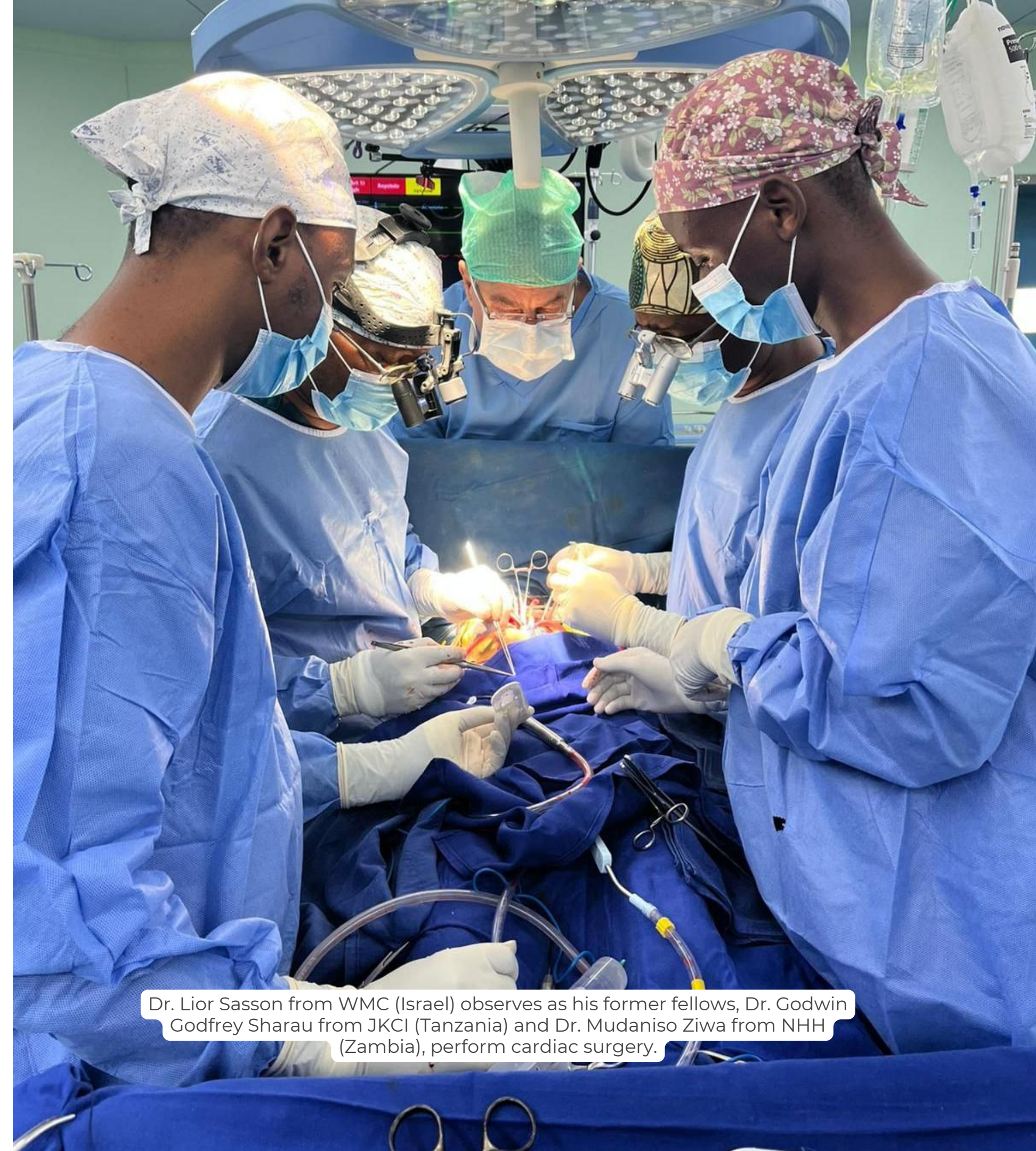
A New Model of Capacity-Building

In 2023, SACH helped forge a groundbreaking Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Ministries of Health of Tanzania, Zambia, and Rwanda. This agreement formalized collaborations between three leading institutions:

- Jakaya Kikwete Cardiac Institute (JKCI) – Tanzania
- National Heart Hospital (NHH) – Zambia
- King Faisal Hospital (KFH) – Rwanda

This model is possible thanks to 15 years of SACH training investment in Africa, creating a connected network of skilled cardiac specialists who now:

- Operate independently in their home countries
- Mentor the next generation of doctors and nurses
- Adapt advanced skills learned in Israel to local realities

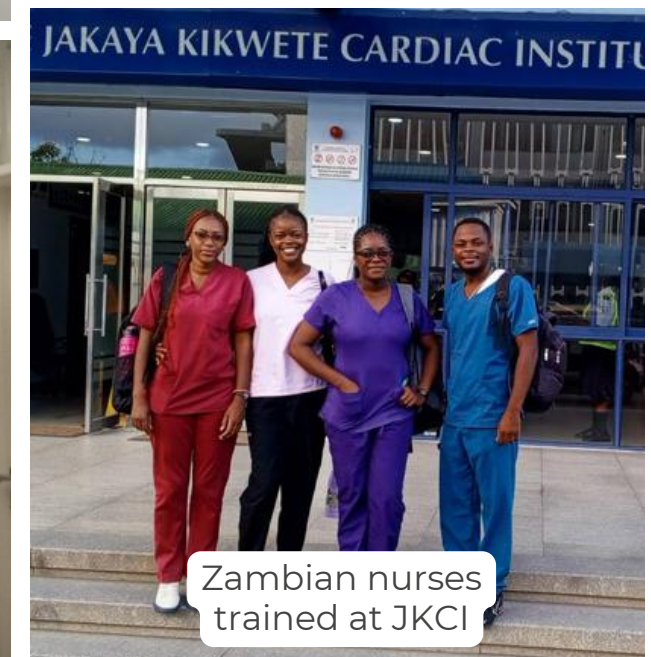

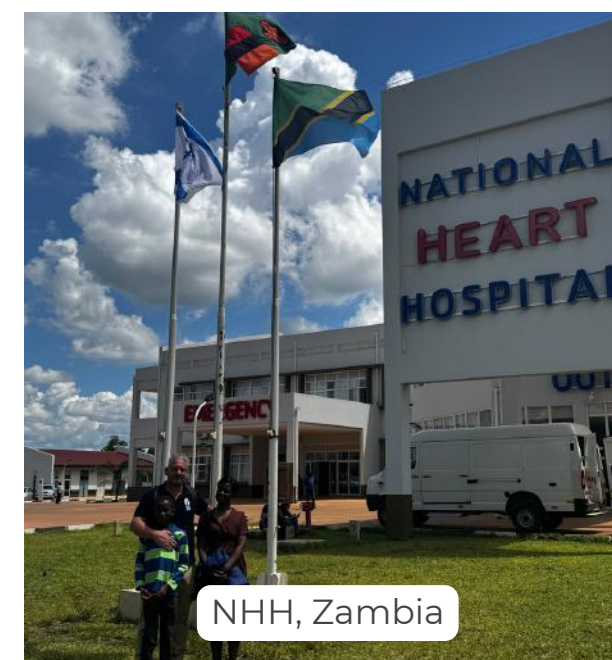

MEET JONATHAN



As the first patient of the third South-to-South mission in December 2024 at Lusaka's National Heart Hospital, eleven-year-old **Jonathan** marked the beginning of a transformative week, having traveled 140 kilometers from his home in Kabwe with his mother for life-saving surgery to repair a ventricular septal defect (VSD).

Following his successful open-heart procedure on December 15th, performed by SACH-trained surgeons Dr. Godwin Godfrey Sharau from JKCI and Dr. Mudaniso Ziwa from NHH, Jonathan—a soccer enthusiast who dreams of becoming a doctor someday—returned home after ten days with renewed energy.



CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE

Led by SACH Graduates

Today, Centers of Excellence are thriving in Tanzania, Rwanda, and Zambia—led by SACH-trained doctors working together across borders through South-to-South cooperation. This model brings together professionals from multiple African nations to strengthen local cardiac care and expand regional capacity.

- Dr. Godwin Godfrey (Tanzania) – Surgeon and head of JKCI’s cardiac program, who also advises colleagues across Africa on adapting procedures to local conditions. **In 2024, 301 surgeries** and **234 catheterizations** were performed at JKCI.
- Dr. Yayu Mekonen (Ethiopian, working in Rwanda) – Surgeon at KFH, operating independently alongside Dr. Habtamu (ICU/PICU specialist trained in Israel). **In 2024, 173 surgeries** and **35 catheterizations** were performed at KFH.
- Dr. Mudaniso Ziwa (Zambia) – Surgeon leading the cardiac surgery program at Zambia’s NHH. **In 2024, 83 surgeries** and **72 catheterizations** were performed at NHH.

These Centers of Excellence are powered by full multidisciplinary teams: surgeons, anesthesiologists, intensivists, cardiologists, heart lung machine technicians and nurses, trained at Wolfson Medical Center in Israel and now working side-by-side to deliver care and train the next generation of specialists.



DOCTORS IN TRAINING

By training doctors from abroad, SACH works towards creating regional centers of medical excellence, so children can be treated in their own communities.

Save a Child's Heart is not only saving lives around the world—we are building a stronger future for healthcare in Israel. Through investments in hospitals, medical education, and next-generation leadership, we are creating lasting impact for Israeli children and families, while reinforcing Israel's global leadership in humanitarian medicine.

SYLVAN ADAMS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL:

A National and Global Hub

The Sylvan Adams Children's Hospital at Wolfson Medical Center has transformed pediatric cardiac care in Israel.

This seven-floor, state-of-the-art facility is home to specialized departments and centers, including:

- The Jacqueline Kahn Pediatric Intensive Care Unit
- The Ida Cabakoff International Pediatric Cardiac Care Center
- The Azrieli Foundation Canada–Israel Surgery and Catheterization Floor
- The Helmsley Pediatric Heart Institute (PHI)
- The Outpatient Clinics - *under construction*
- The Pediatric Department
- The Pediatric Surgery Department
- The International Medical Education and Simulation Center (IMESC) – *under construction* (p. 24).
- The Arison Pediatric Emergency Medicine Center – *under construction* (p.25)

Since opening in 2021, the hospital has treated approximately 22,000 Israeli children. **In 2024 alone, around 5,000 Israeli children** received care at the hospital, alongside hundreds of children from around the world.*

Today, the hospital stands as both a national center of excellence and the heart of Save a Child's Heart's humanitarian mission.

NEXT GENERATION OF ISRAEL'S CARDIAC EXPERTS

Through international fellowships, we empower Israeli doctors to gain world-class expertise and bring it back home.



Dr. Sivan Elkarat

Thanks to the support of SACH Canada, Dr. Elkarat completed her first year of fellowship at SickKids Toronto, specializing in pediatric electrophysiology. She gained hands-on experience managing complex patients and performing advanced procedures.

Now in her second year, Dr. Elkarat is preparing to establish Israel's first independent Pediatric Electrophysiology Service at the Sylvan Adams Children's Hospital.



Dr. Yael Ag-Rejuan

Pediatric cardiac surgeon Dr. Ag-Rejuan is expanding her expertise in adult congenital heart disease through a fellowship at Boston Children's Hospital with the support of SACH US. In 2025, she will continue her training with a six-month fellowship at the CAHAL Center for Congenital Heart Disease in Amsterdam-Leiden.

When she returns to Israel in September 2025, she will bring vital new skills to support SACH's growing focus on lifetime cardiac care, a critical need as more SACH children reach adulthood.

INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL EDUCATION & SIMULATION CENTER (IMESC)

SACH is developing the International Medical Education & Simulation Center (IMESC) at the Sylvan Adams Children's Hospital—the first center of its kind in the MENA region. The IMESC will:

- Provide hands-on training with state-of-the-art mannequins, simulators, and VR imaging technologies.
- Strengthen pediatric healthcare teams across Israel and developing countries.
- Host international medical conferences and simulation-based education programs.

In 2024, the IMESC held 17 specialized training courses with a total of 1,498 participants. Training topics included advanced life support (ACLS, BLS, PALS, PBLS), trauma response (ATLS), surgical team training, ECMO, and pediatric emergency care. Altogether, 3,063 individuals took part in IMESC courses, workshops, and simulation activities throughout the year—including nurses, doctors, paramedics, allied health staff, interns, biomedical technicians, and administrative personnel.

Stage 1 is underway, with \$600,000 USD invested in advanced training equipment and ongoing training courses and activities.

Stage 2 will complete the 1,400 sqm simulation floor estimated at \$5.5M, creating a lasting center for excellence in pediatric care and humanitarian medicine.

THE ARISON PEDIATRIC EMERGENCY MEDICINE CENTER

Opening 2026

Thanks to the support of the Ted Arison Family Foundation and SACH, the new Arison Pediatric Emergency Medicine Center is under construction, situated adjacent to the Sylvan Adams Children's Hospital.

In 2024, we broke ground on this transformative project, marking a major step toward expanding pediatric emergency care in the region, significantly upgrading the emergency department capabilities.

This cutting-edge facility will:

- Be a protected space from rockets and unconventional warfare.
- Deliver the most advanced pediatric emergency care in central Israel.
- Serve the rapidly growing pediatric population of Holon, Bat Yam, southern Tel Aviv, and Rishon LeZion.
- Treat tens of thousands of young emergency patients each year, with seamless access to specialized care within the adjacent Children's Hospital building.







Saving lives takes a village—and at Save a Child’s Heart, that village spans continents. From young advocates and loyal donors to international events and visits, we’re proud to grow a community deeply committed to healing hearts and shaping a healthier future.

YOUNG LEADERSHIP: CREATING LIFELONG AMBASSADORS

In a year shaped by conflict, travel restrictions, and rising antisemitism on campuses, our Young Leadership program remained strong. Youth and young professionals from Israel and around the world came together to raise awareness and funds, offering hands-on support to the children in our care, becoming lifelong advocates.

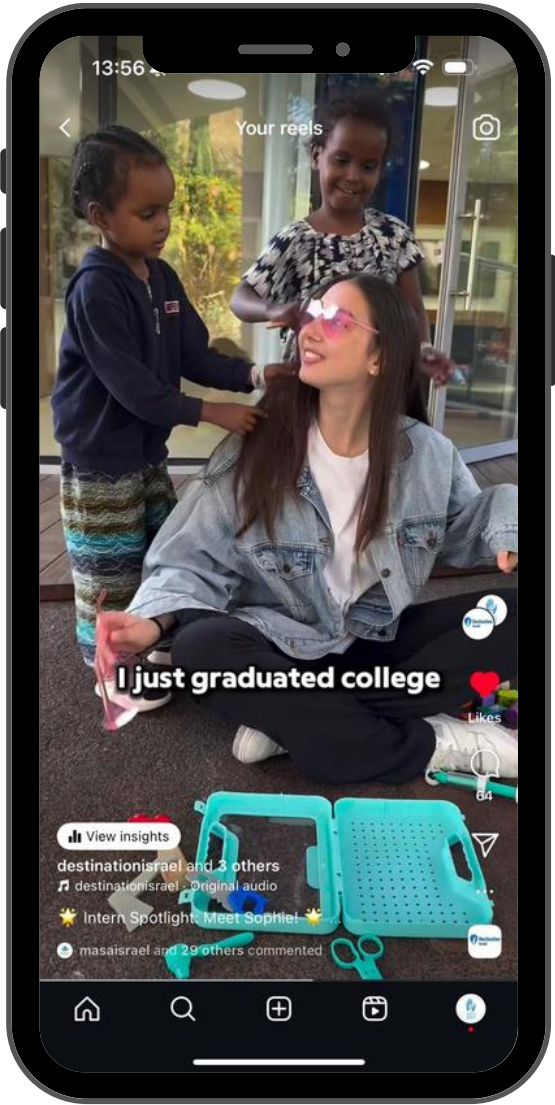
INTERN SPOTLIGHT MEET SOPHIE

DORIT: A DECADE OF DEVOTION

Dorit first heard about Save a Child's Heart years ago but truly connected with the mission after she retired. From her first visit, she was hooked. "I fell in love with the children, with the idea of saving lives, with a place where everyone is equal," she says. "A place where a mother is a mother, no matter where she's from."

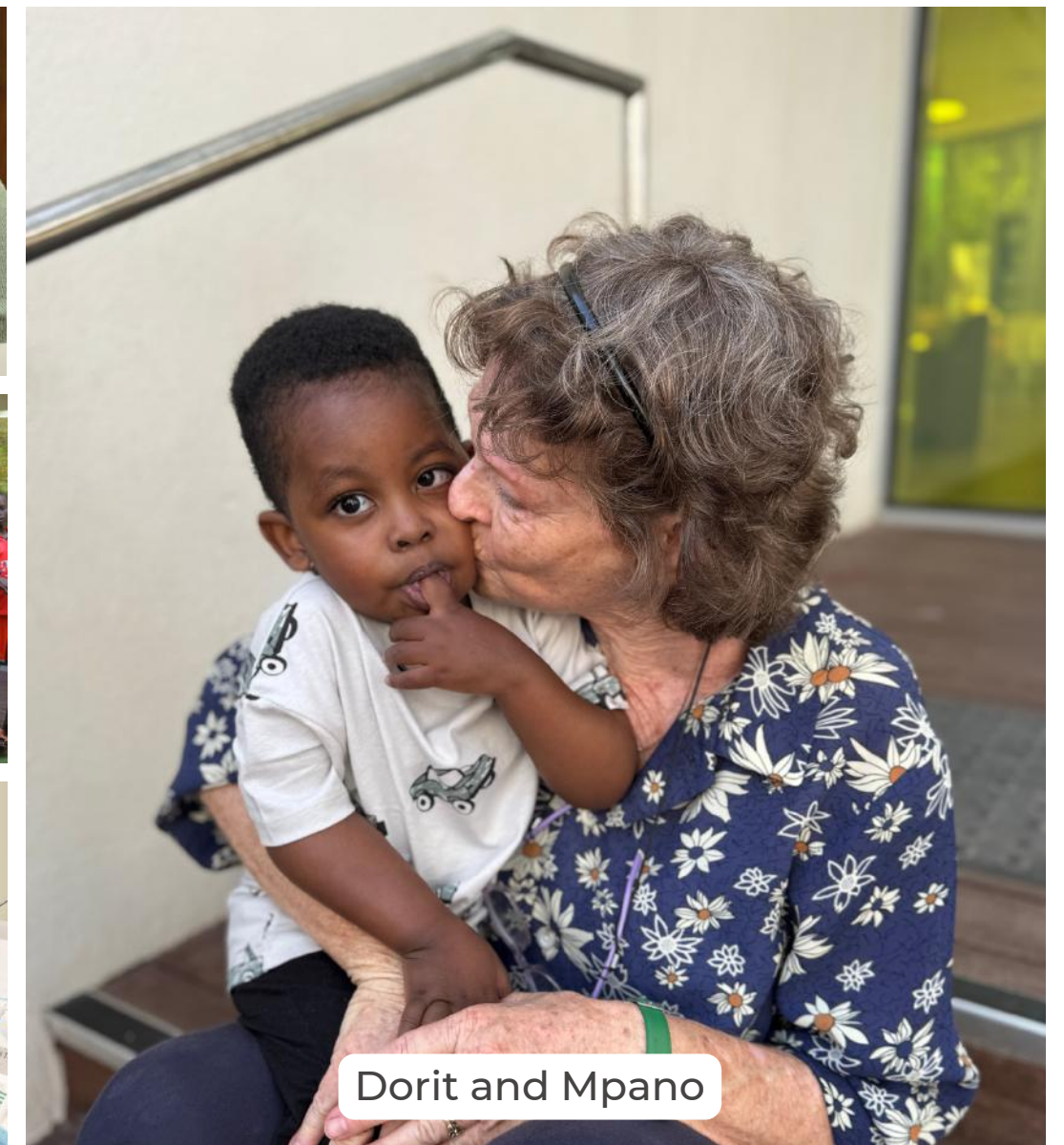
Over the past ten years, Dorit has become a constant presence, offering comfort, support, and a quiet strength to the children and mothers in the hospital.

Then came Mpano. He arrived from Rwanda at six months old in 2022 and has been hospitalized ever since. Through it all, Dorit has been by his side. He learned to talk and took his first steps at the hospital, with Dorit right there, cheering him on. He calls her *Safta* (grandmother). Even during the most challenging times of war in 2024, Dorit never stopped showing up, bringing care, calm, and strength.

With a background in special education and speech therapy, Dorit also supported his development, helping him learn numbers, letters, and colors beyond what's expected for his age.

"I simply love him and his mother," she says. "Supporting them feels like supporting my own family."

Like Dorit, our long-time Israeli volunteers, Gefen, Leah, and Irit, are the heart of our mission. They remind us that healing takes not just medicine, but love, presence, and community.

A Legacy of Healing

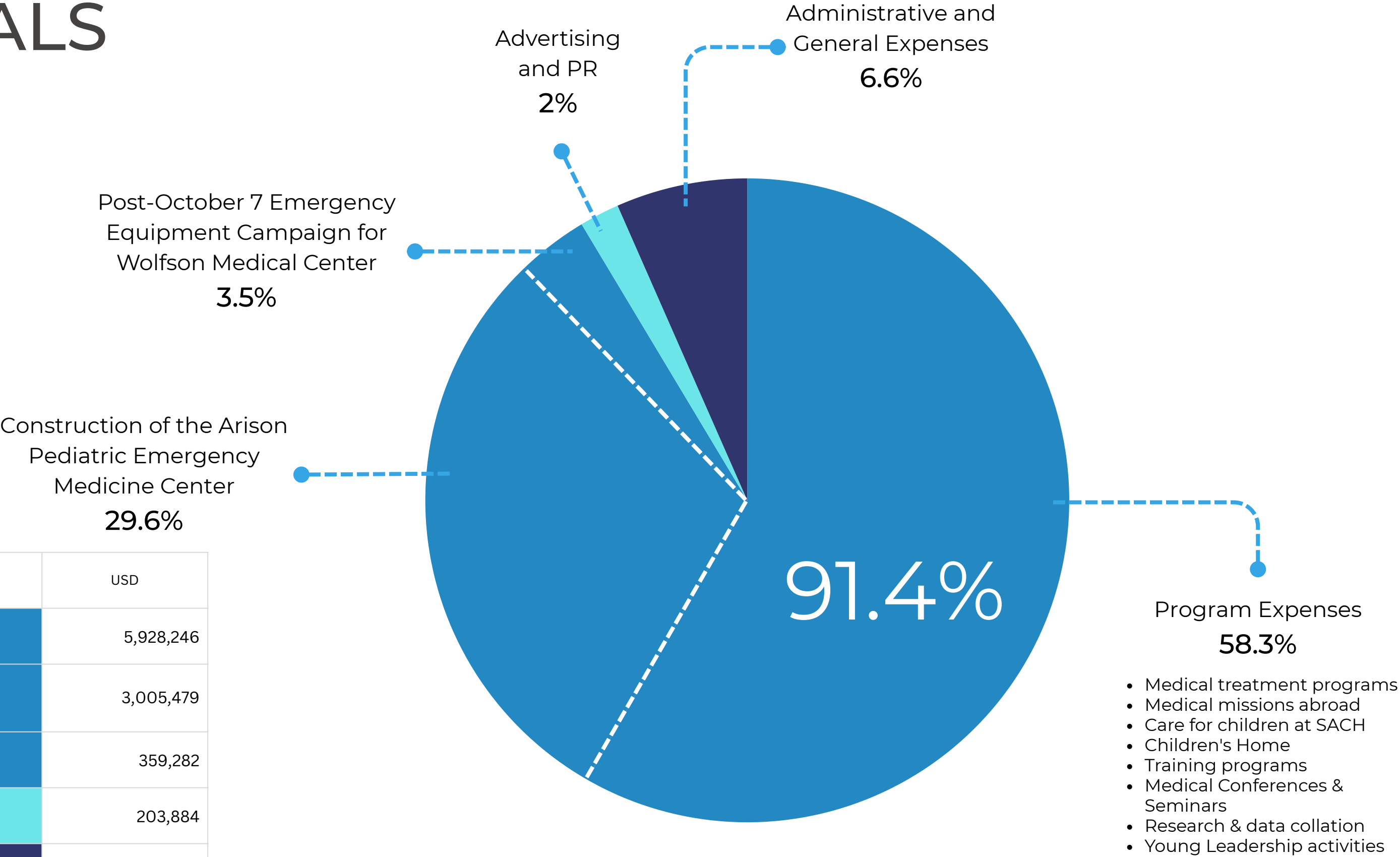
