Dear LCAO Student,

Upon completing your training at London College of Animal Osteopathy, you will receive certification as an Equine, Canine, or Animal Osteopath, highlighting your commitment to holistic animal care.

In your online clinical module, you have been actively honing your treatment skills under the expert guidance of Stuart McGregor. To further enhance your techniques and boost your confidence, we invite you to attend hands-on Masterclasses held at different locations throughout the year.

Over nine clinical days—four focused on canines and five on equines—you will solidify your assessment and treatment skills rooted in classical structural osteopathy.

Under the supervision of Professor McGregor and his skilled team of instructors, you will refine your osteopathic articular balancing techniques while learning advanced direct methods. The training will involve manipulating the equine cervical, thoracic, and lumbar vertebrae, pelvis, hip, distal limb P2/P3, and shoulder. Furthermore, you will be introduced to cranial and visceral osteopathy, functional techniques, and short-lever recoil techniques specifically for canines.

Throughout the Masterclass, you will observe and treat animals of various ages and breeds. During one-on-one mentorship sessions and group discussions, you will be encouraged to cultivate treatment approaches tailored to your area of specialization.

Palpation & Treatment Skills

The ability to palpate accurately is crucial for delivering effective treatment. Instructors emphasize the importance of honing palpation skills and enhancing tactile sensitivity.

This skill is especially significant for employing involuntary mechanisms (IVM) in cranial osteopathy, as well as for functional and myofascial release techniques. By the conclusion of the Masterclass seminar, you will be proficient in applying these techniques.

- See' the anatomy with your hands.
- Differentiate between qualities of tissue texture and mobility.
- Identify which tissues need attention.
- Treat the problem you have identified.
- Trust your judgment and start creating change.
- Manipulate using high-end HVLA techniques.
- Treat using OAB, Craniosacral, Functional, and
- Myofascial Release techniques.

Admission

We will begin with a brief lecture on theory at 9 a.m. to cover relevant topics and prepare you for the practical, hands-on session.

This schedule applies to both Canine and Equine Masterclasses, with mid-morning and mid-afternoon breaks for animals and students to rest and reflect.




To guarantee your experience with a variety of breeds, sizes, and ages of animals, you will engage with more than 25 horses and 50 dogs sourced from nearby communities.

Registered Osteopath U.K. Animal Osteopath

Professor McGregor is acknowledged as a leading global expert in Animal Osteopathy. He graduated from the European School of Osteopathy (ESO) in Maidstone, United Kingdom, in 1984. His thesis, titled "The Principles of Osteopathy Applied to the Horse," is the first recorded work on the classical structural approach in equine osteopathy. With over 40 years of clinical and teaching experience, Professor McGregor has trained most of the animal osteopaths currently practicing in the U.K. and numerous other countries around the world.

Stuart's groundbreaking Osteopathic Articular Balancing (OAB) methodology, refined through decades of clinical and teaching practice, has been used by hundreds of osteopathic professionals worldwide.

Professor McGregor is the Director of Clinical Studies at London College of Animal Osteopathy (LCAO) and is a founder of Osteopathic Centre for Animals (OCA) in the United Kingdom.





Rachel Mahoney, DO

Rachel graduated from Unitec Institute of Technology in Auckland, New Zealand, with a Master's in Osteopathy in 2004.
