UP TO 300,000 AUSTRALIANS WILL BE ON AGED CARE WAITLIST BY 2030 **By Tom McIlroy, *The Guardian***

Expert is forecasting a shortfall of more than 171,000 in-home packages by next June, to grow by about 30,000 places each year.

Kathy Eagar, a former adviser to the aged care royal commission and a University of New South Wales adjunct professor, has forecast demand for in-home packages under Labor’s changes to the national aged care system, now due to come into force from 1 November. Using Australian Bureau of Statistics population data and waitlist projections, Adjunct Professor Eagar finds a shortfall of more than 171,000 places by June next year – an unmet demand of 31 per cent. The waitlist, which grows each year by about 30,000 places, is forecast to reach more than 301,000 by June 2030, representing a shortfall of 44 per cent.

Figures included in the 2025-26 federal budget papers show a 27 per cent increase in residential aged care spending and just a 0.3 per cent increase in new support for home packages over the four-year forward estimates period.

Separately, documents tabled in Senate estimates hearings last week show that at the end of September, nearly 122,000 people on the national priority system were waiting for a home care package. The figure has risen from 96,709 at the end of June this year. Professor Eagar has joined groups, including community organisation Meals on Wheels, in calling on the Government to maintain the existing Commonwealth Home Support program, set to be rolled into the new system. It provides entry-level care for seniors at home. Eagar said the new system – originally expected to come into force from 1 July this year but delayed to give the sector more time for implementation – faced a rough start.

“The 2025-26 budget has no growth beyond 30 June 2026 for Support at Home, the waiting list has increased 26% in just three months, around 10% of all public hospital beds across Australia are now occupied by patients awaiting aged care placement and the government doesn’t seem to even recognise there’s a problem,” she said.

Greens aged care spokesperson Penny Allman-Payne said Labor had not released enough new home care packages, warning elderly people would continue to die while waiting for assessments and care packages to begin. It takes over six months, in many cases, for people just to get an assessment, to get care, and then when they finally do get assessed and they think that they’re at the point where they’re going to get the help that they need,” she told Guardian Australia. “Then they can be waiting up to 12 months and sometimes even 18 months then to actually get the care. That’s devastating for people.

Aged Care Minister Sam Rae said the Albanese Government was working to address growing demand in the system.

“Our government is embarking on this once-in-a-generation reform to ensure every older Australian can get the care they need, when they need it,” he said.
