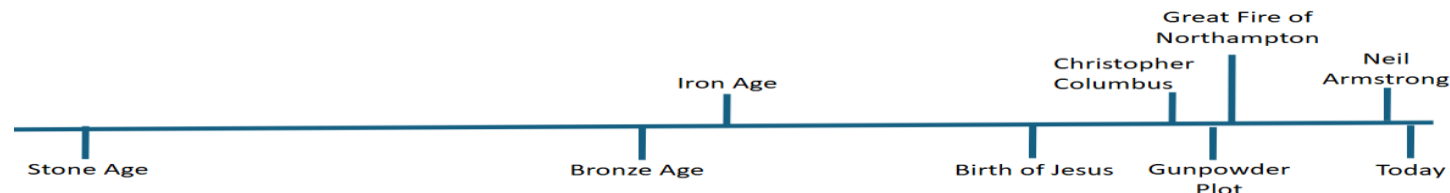

### Prehistory

The period of time in the past before people could write

### Hunter-gatherer

Groups of people who get food by hunting, fishing and foraging rather than farming

### Archaeologists

Someone who studies the buildings, graves, tools and other objects of people who lived in the past.

### Nomad

A member of group of people who travel from place to place rather than living in one place all the time

### Tribes

A group of people that live together for protection

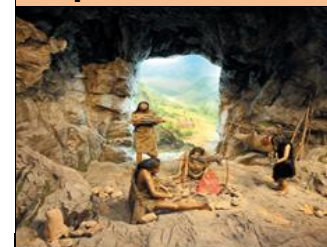
### Celt

A person belonging to a group of people from western Europe who came to live in ancient Britain before the Romans.

## Important Time Periods



Early Stone Age people did not have homes but travelled to follow the food. They took shelter in caves or made tents using animal skins.



By the Bronze Age, people were living in small settlements that were made up of their family members. Metals were used to make tools.



In the Iron Age, the Celts lived in much larger settlements built on the top of hills. These were known as hill forts and gave the community protection from other tribes.

## BC and AD

BC means Before Christ.

A date such as 3000BC means 3000 years before the year 1 AD (there was no year zero)

AD – means Anno Domini in Latin which stands for 'in the year of our lord'. A date such as 2018 AD means 2018 years after Jesus is supposed to have been born.
