## Attending school every day really matters!

#### Did You Know?

Evidence shows that children who miss even a couple of days a month of school can struggle to feel fully included in school life. This can affect children's self-esteem and lead them to feel worried about their work and their friendships.

Children with too many absences find it difficult to catch up. Multiple gaps in children's learning e.g. missed phonic sounds or missed methods in maths can be difficult to catch up on - catch up means missing other learning. This can put children at a long-term disadvantage.

Evidence suggests that poor attendance in primary school often leads to poor attendance at secondary school. This can impact on children's future success in the workplace.

All families have hopes and dreams for their children.

Children thrive when they feel fully included and have a sense of belonging.

Attending school every day really matters!

#### What can you do?

- · Establish good bedtime and morning routines.
- If your child has mild symptoms of illness, for example a cold or slight tummy ache (if
  you feel they can manage school) please send them in and we will contact you if they
  become too poorly. The distraction of a busy school day often helps them feel better.
- . We are always here to help. Come in and talk things through with us.
- · Avoid taking holidays during term time. This can result in a fine.
