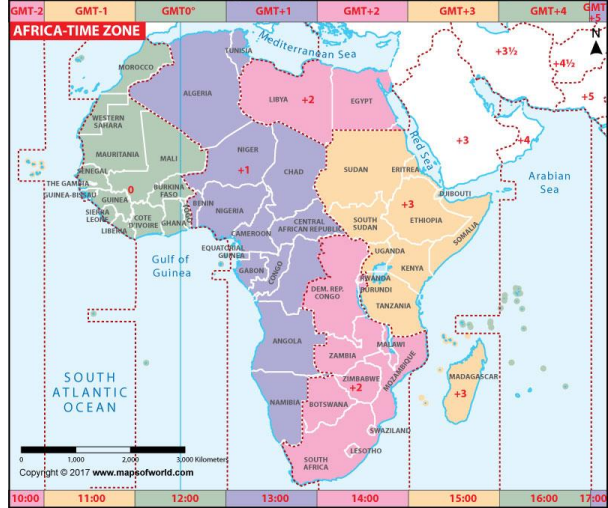
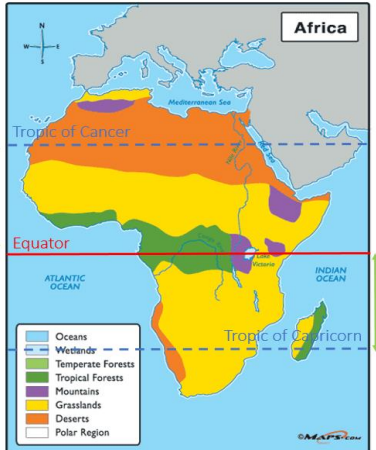

Diverse	If a group or range of things is diverse, it is made up of a wide variety of things.		
Stereotype	A stereotype is a fixed set of characteristics that a lot of people believe represent a particular type of person or thing.		
Natural resources	Resources that exist or occur in nature and are not made or caused by people (e.g. wind, water, oil, metals).		
Vegetation	refers to all plant life e.g. plants, trees, and flowers.	Biomes	
Perception	Your perception of something is the way that you think about it or the impression you have of it.		
Savannah	Open grasslands, usually with scattered bushes or trees		
Biome	a large area of the planet with similar climate, landscapes, plants and animals		
GMT Greenwich Mean Time	The standard time in Great Britain which is used to calculate the time in the rest of the world.		
Plateau	A large area of high and fairly flat land.		
			African biomes: - Tropical rainforest - Grasslands - Desert - Temperate forest Africa's main physical regions: - the Sahara, - the Sahel, - the Ethiopian Highlands, - the Savannah, - the Congo rain forest, Some of these regions cover large areas of the continent while others are remote areas. Each of these regions has unique animal and plant communities.
