








Protestant	<div>A protestant is a Christian with different religious beliefs to Catholic Christians. Throughout history these two religious groups have had many conflicts.</div>	
Line of succession	<div>The order in which individuals are expected to succeed one another as the monarch</div>	
Heir	<div>A person who inherits and continues the work of the person before them</div>	
Descendant	<div>Someone’s descendants are the people in later generations who are related to them</div>

William was born around 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1564 and died on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 1616.
