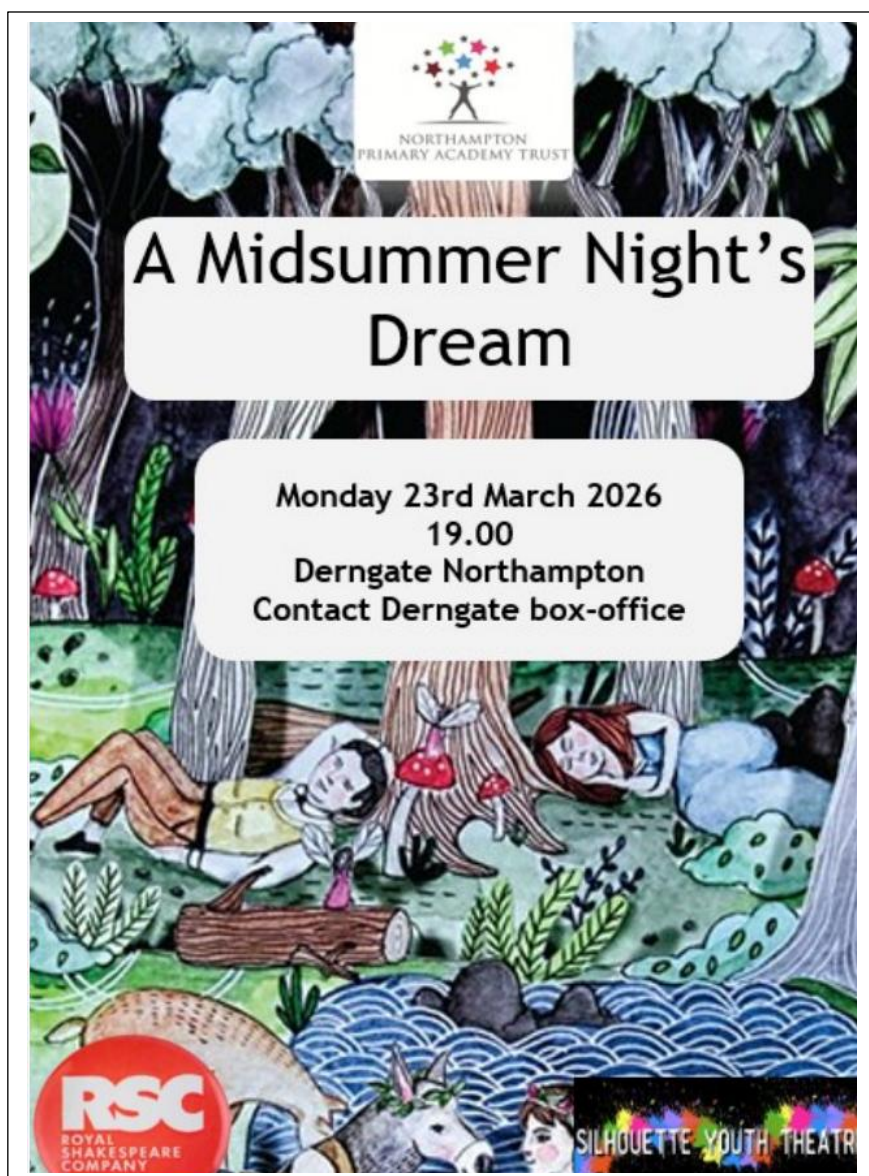
Parenting Sessions

Safety Online - Roblox

We have been made aware that the Roblox system has introduced a facial recognition system to check the ages of people using the system.

Once users complete an age check, they are assigned to one of six age groups: under 9, 9–12, 13–15, 16–17, 18–20, and 21+. By default, users in each age group can chat with users in the groups directly above and below theirs (i.e., users 9-12 can chat with users in their own group, as well as those in the under 9 and 13-15 groups.) This facial recognition is not always accurate meaning that some of our children have been identified as over 18.

To safeguard Roblox's youngest users, chat is turned off by default for children identified as under age 9, unless a parent provides additional consent.

Please check age identified and chat groupings for your child, to ensure they are not in older chat groups.
