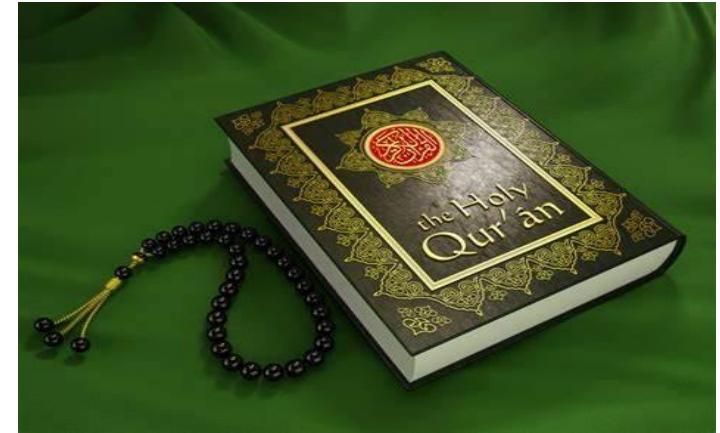


Year 6 Knowledge Organiser: What is important to Muslims?

VOCABULARY

Islam	The religion of Muslims.
Muslim	A follower of the religion of Islam.
Five Pillars	The five obligations that every Muslim must satisfy in order to live a good and responsible life.
Foundations	Underlying basis or principle.
Arabic	A language of the Arabs, spoken by some 150 million people throughout the Middle East and North Africa. The Qur'an was first revealed in Arabic.
Qur'an	The sacred text of Islam.
Mosque	A Muslim place of worship.
Allah	God in Arabic.
Muhammad (PBUH – Peace Be Upon Him)	Prophet (messenger) and founder of Islam.
Shahadah	Pillar 1 - The belief in Allah and Muhammad as his messenger.
Monotheistic	The belief that there is only one God.
Prophet	In religion, a prophet is said to be in contact with a divine being.
Salah	Pillar 2 – Prayer
Mecca	The birthplace of Muhammad (PBUH) in Saudi Arabia.
Kaaba	A cubed in the court of the Great Mosque at Mecca.
Wudu	The act of washing certain body parts before prayer.
Zakat	Pillar 3 – Charity of 2.5% of wealth which Muslims should pay.

Sawm	Pillar 4 - The Arabic word for fasting.
Ramadan	The holy ninth month of the Islamic calendar, during which time Muslims refrain from eating or drinking during sunrise.
Eid-el-Fitr	A festival which marks the end of the month long period of Ramadan.
Hajj	Pillar 5 - A pilgrimage which takes place annually to the holy city of Mecca; Muslims try to carry out at least once in their lifetime.
Pilgrimage	A journey made to a sacred place or a religious journey.
Ismail	Regarded as a prophet in Islam and an ancestor of Muhammad. He helped his father build the Kaaba.
Hagar	Wife of the prophet Abraham. She gave birth to his first son Ismail
Surah	A verse in the Qur'an.
Islamophobia	Dislike or prejudice against Muslims or Islam.
