History of the Nursing Pin

The nursing pin is an important symbol of service earned by graduates of nursing programs nationwide. Each nursing school has its own distinctive pin and symbolism. The tradition at Emory dates back more than 100 years to when the School of Nursing—then called The Wesley Memorial Hospital Training School for Nurses—was located in downtown Atlanta at the corner of Auburn Avenue and Courtland Street. The first pins were awarded in 1907 to graduates of this program. The gold pin, inspired by the Maltese Cross worn by the knights of the Crusades, included a dark red cross, surrounded by delicate gold filigree, holding a white enamel banner over the cross with the letters WMH.

In 1967 Emory's board of trustees honored Mrs. Woodruff and her lifelong love for the nursing profession, by naming the school the Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of Nursing and the initials on the banner of the pin became "NHWSN."

Today, the pin still represents Emory nurses' commitment to their profession and to serving the needs of society. It identifies graduates as Emory nurses and symbolizes their connection to every Emory nurse who has come before them and all who will follow in the future. Emory nurses around the world wear their pins with pride, professionalism, and dedication.

Emory Alma Mater

It graces every Commencement ceremony. It closes every Legacy Brunch. It rings from the bell tower on Cox Hall every day at noon. Emory's Alma Mater was written by J. Marvin Rast (1918C 1929T), a campus leader from Louisville, Georgia, who sang in the Glee Club and was elected to membership in the DVS Senior Society. The original version, since revised, was first performed at Emory's Commencement in 1918. As with hundreds of alma maters for high schools, colleges, and universities, it is sung to the tune, "Annie Lisle."
