1st Reading: Genesis 18:1—10a

The Lord appeared to Abraham in the form of three visitors. Abraham invited them to his home, and he and Sarah prepared them a generous meal.

2nd Reading: Colossians 1:24—28

The apostle Paul found suffering a joy, in order to build up the body of Christ, the church. By preaching the fullness of God's revelation, Paul hoped every person might become complete in Christ.

Gospel: Luke 10:38—42

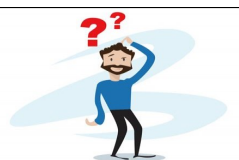

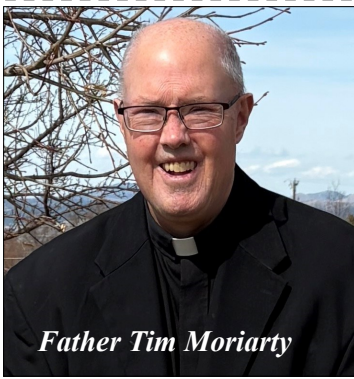

Father Tim Moriarty's Autobiography

Born and raised in Deer Lodge.
I graduated from Powell County High
School 45 years ago.

I attended University of Montana for a
time; graduated from then Western
Montana College in the summer of
1985; and also attended the College of
Great Falls, where I was a news intern
for KRTV in the fall of 1985.

Then began a several-year career with the National Park Service;
working mainly at historical sites from the east coast to the west
coast; all the while a vocation continued to simmer in my heart.

In 1992-93, I spent time as a postulant and novice at Mount Angel
Abbey, Oregon with the Benedictine monks. It was a powerful
experience. The prayerful life I have today is an attribute to the
time I spent there; for which I'll be forever grateful.

After Mount Angel, I spent time as a substitute teacher in Deer
Lodge, as I continued to discern a call from the Lord.

In 1996, I began seminary at the University of St. Thomas in St.
Paul, Minnesota as a seminarian for our Diocese; thus, beginning a
seven year journey to the priesthood; culminating in my ordination
to the priesthood— with Father Jeff Benusa on June 6, 2003.

I've been assigned to the Cathedral of St Helena; Holy Family
Parish, Three Forks and then— Valley of Flowers, Belgrade;
Anaconda Catholic Community with Holy Family and St. Peter's
Church; St. William, Shelby with correctional minister at
Crossroads; St. Margaret's, Cut Bank; St. Thomas Aquinas,
Sunburst; St. Francis, Valier—and for the last three years Pastor of
St. Mary Catholic Community just up the road ;
and now Administrator for Our Lady of the Valley.

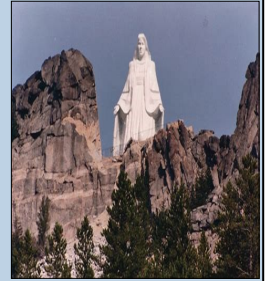
I enjoy hiking, swimming, golf, tennis, traveling; and being with

November in an amazing journey; for which I'll be forever
grateful.
