22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time August 31st Readings

Sirach 3:17—18, 20, 28—29, Hebrews 12:18—19, 22—24a Luke 14:1, 7—14



1st Reading: Jeremiah 38:4—6, 8—10

The princes were eager to kill Jeremiah because he constantly challenged them to follow God's law. The king allowed them to throw Jeremiah into a cistern. A friend interceded with the king and rescued Jeremiah.

2nd Reading: Hebrews 12:1—4

Gospel: Luke 13:22-30

Jesus told the people, "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." Make yourself known to the Lord so that the door will open for you. Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and the prophets will be safe in God's reign. "Some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last.





"Nicholas Black Elk was living in Heaven long before his death."

Nicholas Black Elk (1858-66 – 8/19/1950) was a holy man throughout his life. With his Lakota spirituality, he prayed with others, offering hope in challenging times. Later, as a catechist for the Catholic Church, he continued to pray with people, guiding them toward hope in Christ. Despite the trials he faced, he kept his focus on something greater than his earthly journey. He was shown a vision of all of us living together. This is a message we need today.


