The Exaltation of the Holy Cross September 14th Readings

1st Reading: Numbers 21:4b—9During their journey from Egypt, the Israelites complain against God and Moses and the

travelers are plagued by deadly serpents.
Realizing the sin of their complaints, they plead with Moses to pray for their deliverance.
God instructs Moses to "make a saraph" and "if any who have been bitten look at it, they will live."

2nd Reading: Philippians 2:6—11

Paul uses a hymn of praise to tell the Christian community of Philippi about Christ's concealing his divinity and assuming the role of servant during his life. Christ humbled himself completely, "becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." This led to his being exalted by God.

Gospel: John 3:13—17

Jesus tells Nicodemus that God gave his Son that those who believe in him will not die but live eternally. He came, not to condemn the world, but to save it.




We are seeking a qualified individual to assume the Maintenance and Janitorial position.

SERVANT OF GOD NICHOLAS BLACK ELK

"Nicholas Black Elk was living in Heaven long before his death." -Father Lois Escalante (Rome, Italy)

Nicholas Black Elk (1858-66 - 8/19/1950) was a holy man throughout his life. With his Lakota spirituality, he prayed with others, offering hope in challenging times. Later, as a catechist for the Catholic Church, he continued to pray with people, guiding them toward hope in Christ. Despite the trials he faced, he kept his focus on something greater than his earthly journey. He was shown a vision of all of us living together. This is a message we need today.

OLV Memories

In the original days of OLV, we shared space with the Baptist church and I was very intrigued with the "swimming pool" behind the alter. Occasionally the Baptists would leave the cover off since they had just had a baptism. I had never seen such a thing. I also have fond memories of my mother (Mary Dolan) playing the organ, my dad skipping church, and all six of us siblings lined up (probably in a very specific order) in one pew. Right behind us would be the Glisans. Russ and Fran would tap us on the shoulder if we started to get out of line. Mother was watching from the organ and would give the Glisans a nod to give us the tap and point to our Mom who would give us a glare and get us to return our focus to the service!

I remember running around the church yard and social hall when we had social events. My sisters and I snuck a half cup of coffee and tried it out. I immediately spat it out and thought, who could drink this stuff! It was a very small church, and we eventually outgrew the space and built the original Our Lady of the Valley church. The whole time I was growing up and attending church here, Father Sodja was the priest. I guess that was uncommon for a priest to stay with a church for 10 years, but he was a very kind man. Once, he packed up the six of us siblings in his station wagon and took us to Fairmont Hot Springs. We were all playing in the swimming pool and he taught two of my siblings how to swim. Much later, when I was a senior in high school, he taught our Confirmation class. Mine was not the first, but there weren't a lot of teens in the congregation, so we didn't do it every year. Christy, my younger sister, and I attended. Father Sodja was not really botherer by our rowdy behavior and was very able to keep us on track. We even had a lock-in at the church the night before the confirmation.

I also have great memories of the Helping Hands committee that came to our house when my mother was struggling to make ends meet after my parents split up. They scraped all the exterior clapboards and repainted the whole house. We couldn't have done it alone, and all those people coming together and helping was amazing.

I also have memories of Marcella Hanson offering up her home for childcare during church services on Sunday mornings. Her house was just a street or two away and she had a large family room that was perfect. I would go over to her house about a ½ hour before service started and watch the younger kids so their parents could attend. She was always so gracious about having me there early and leaving me to watch all the kids in her home.

There was so much trust shared by all the people in encountered through the church. The sense of shared responsibility for each other was and is still carried with me as an adult.

There may have been an adult you enlisted to keep an eye on us. I met my lifelong friend Linda in that church, we've been friends 50 years now, confirmed together in the "new" church. The music in OLV has spoiled me for other Catholic churches – so uplifting and full of life. It feels like "coming home" when we are back and can attend there.

OLV has always been "home" for me. We moved to Helena in 1986 when I was young and our family found it a perfect fit. My favorite memories are from "Break at the Lake" which was a weekend for members of OLV to spend time at a church camp on Flathead Lake. There were cabins, communal dining, games, skits, swimming, and lots of community building fun. I can't even imagine how great something like this would be now with how much OLV has grown and all the families and kids! Our family had the best time.

I remember pancake breakfasts in the original church, the folding chairs with orange, yellow, and brown cushions that made a swishing sound when you sat on them...you could really hear it with all the ups/downs us Catholics do during mass.

High School Religious Education (RE back in the 90's) was great with both Dan Dodge and Jack Ward. We had some fun fundraisers. Jack was especially skilled at keeping teenagers engaged enough that we got something out of it. He was a large part of my growth as a Catholic, much like I think our current Faith Formation teachers and volunteers are. OLV continues to have a great reputation for engaging our youth, creating a thriving community and our next generation of Catholics. I have been a witness to this for the last 39 years!

Through all my memories, there is one common thread. The PEOPLE. People of all ages and walks of life. Christ's people. People who lead, listen, support, love, laugh with, cry with, and engage in active ministry to the community and to each other. This is why I am a member of OLV. It's a gift and it keeps on giving.
