2nd Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6—8, 16—18

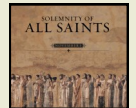

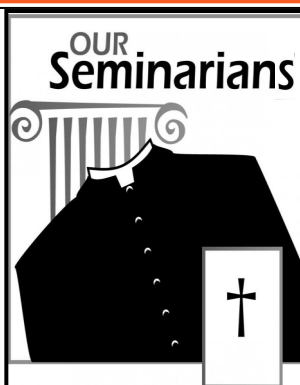

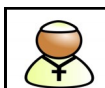
