



Supply List for Miss Boron's Fourth Grade Class; 2026-2027 School Year

Dear Parents,

Every year that I compose this list, I remind myself that every one of these items costs money. I respect that. Therefore, I try to keep my list reasonable. I have added some qualifications that I have learned make our year easier (for example, soft pencil pouches rather than hard boxes).

Composition books—Please send your child with two. Also, please choose ones with either different colors or designs on the cover. Please do not send composition books that have graphic pictures on them.

Folders—Eeeeeeks! Could you provide five of them for your child? Again, if they could be different colors or designs, it is helpful as we use them for different things. Also, please choose ones that have two pockets. My students do not need binders. They take up so much room in their desks. Folders are so much better.

No. 2 pencils. Mechanical pencils are not permitted. Ticonderoga are the absolute best ones as far as the quality of the lead goes. Also, please choose the pre-sharpened ones.

Pens—one blue and one red pen; please do not send black pens. Another hint...the Bic pens are the best (the ones with the clear body and colored lid).

A pink eraser—generally speaking, the erasers on the top of pencils do not work very well.

Crayons or colored pencils. Markers are not permitted.

Scissors and one or two glue sticks. Please do not send liquid glue.

Pencil pouch. As mentioned above, please send a soft pouch.

One or two packages of copy paper. I love to use colored paper for different months, so if that is available (the pastels), that would be great. White is always used, too.

Please do not buy:

1. Hand sanitizer
2. Notebook Paper (I have plenty from previous years)

If you can:

1. Softsoap
2. one package of wipes
3. napkins that we use at lunchtime
4. one roll of paper towels
5. Kleenex
