

Lauren Rothman named Managing Director of Hadassah Super South



Hadassah Greater Atlanta is pleased to announce that Lauren Rothman has been named Managing Director of Hadassah Super South, responsible for the operation of 46 Hadassah chapters comprising more than 15,000 Hadassah members. The geographic area Rothman will oversee comprises Alabama, Arkansas, the Florida Panhandle, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, most of North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, part of West Virginia and all of southern Virginia.

Rothman comes from a multigenerational Hadassah family and previously served as Managing Director of Hadassah West. She has been with Hadassah for a total of nearly two decades. In Hadassah's Super South, Rothman will work with the staff and local volunteer leaders to advance Hadassah's mission – to stand up for Israel, fight antisemitism, advocate for women's health and support the Hadassah Medical Organization, Hadassah's academic medical center in Jerusalem.

Ellen Finkelstein, CEO, Hadassah, says "We are fortunate to be able to bring Lauren's exceptional skills and experience to bear on the critical role of Managing Director of Hadassah Super South. I know she will bring excellence and insight into her new role."

Terry Nordin, President of Hadassah Greater Atlanta, states, "We extend a warm southern welcome to Lauren and are excited to work with her."

Lauren Rothman explains, "Hadassah gives women the opportunity to grow and become agents of change. I look forward to introducing new women to this incredible organization and to continuing the work of advocating for women's health equity, Israel and Zionism."

Simone Wilker, Advocacy Chair for Hadassah Southeastern Region, says, "We would like the Atlanta community to learn that on June 13 Hadassah's Gandel Rehabilitation Hospital Mount Scopus **in** Jerusalem, nicknamed the "God Forbid Hospital", became the "Thank God Hospital". The Center was transformed into an emergency hospital. Hadassah staff worked around the clock. The doctors and nurses are Jewish, Muslim, Christian and the same for the patients. Patient care continued without a pause when emergency sirens warning of enemy missiles or drones sounded."

Hadassah explains "From the River to the Sea"

Central to Hadassah's mission is a staunch and unequivocal support for Israel's sovereignty and security. In 1964, Yasser Arafat, president of the Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO), called for "the recovery of the usurped homeland in its entirety," the establishment of a single state that extended from the Jordan River to the Mediterranean Sea to encompass its historic territories. While there are no clear records of who first created or said the phrase, it has been used in various versions since the 1960s. There are clear records of the slogan being used in the first intifada in 1987. There are versions in Arabic and English.

One Arabic version of "from the river to the sea/Palestine will be free" has a focus on freedom. It was used in the 1980s and that was a call to Palestinians that were displaced in 1948.

Another Arabic version, "from the water to the water/Palestine is Arab", has an Arab nationalist sentiment. Arab nationalism is the political ideology that Arabs constitute a single nation. This version of the phrase alluded to the belief that Israel should become an Arab Nation.

A third Arabic version of "from the water to the water/Palestine is Islamic" has Islamic sentiment. This phrase illustrates backlash to Israel being created as a home for the Jews.

The version from English speakers of "From the river to the sea, Palestine will be free" has circulated among English speakers expressing solidarity with Palestine since at least the 1990s. This version, while not fully expressing it, essentially says "Palestine will be free from the Jews"

The phrase is antisemitic and anti-Zionist, implying that Jews do not have the right to live in Israel and that Israel should not have been established in the first place. Since October 7 it has been chanted at pro-Palestinian protests and solidarity rallies. The chant is used to suggest that Jews do not have any right to the land, that they are not indigenous to Israel, and that all Jews currently living in Israel need to leave by any means necessary. This is also being used on social media as another antisemitism tool.

Simone Wilker, Advocacy Chair for Hadassah Greater Atlanta explains, "Hadassah thanks the United States government for support and urges all nations and leaders to speak out for Israel's right to defend itself against all threats that endanger the safety and security of Israeli citizens."

Israel's First Total Artificial Heart Transplant Performed at Hadassah this May

The life of a 63-year-old patient was saved thanks to a full artificial heart transplant performed in late May for the first time in Israel — at Hadassah Hospital Ein Kerem. The complex operation was led by a large medical team that included cardiologists, cardiac surgeons, anesthesiologists, intensive-care specialists, operating room nurses and a heart-lung machine technician.

The patient's heart was removed and replaced with a special artificial heart made of titanium, combined with biological animal tissues and advanced sensors.

The intricate seven-hour surgery was made possible only after a Hadassah team traveled to France for specialized training, accompanied by local cardiac surgeons and representatives of the French company that developed the artificial heart. There, the team mastered the transplant procedure and trained the rest of the medical team upon returning to Israel.

Prof. Offer Amir, director of Hadassah's Heart Institute, explains, "This is a major milestone in Israel — something unprecedented — so we needed extensive coordination with the patient's HMO and the Ministry of Health, with the full backing of Hadassah's leadership."

The patient, a central-Israel resident, was in critical condition. His life was severely impaired, and he faced serious risk of death while waiting for a suitable donor heart. The expert team concluded that no other option could buy him time — yet tests also confirmed he was a good candidate for the artificial heart procedure.

Dr. Amit Korach, head of the Department of Cardiothoracic Surgery at the Hadassah Medical Organization and director of Israel's first artificial heart transplant, explained that until now, Israeli patients requiring advanced cardiac devices received partial support systems which help patients with left-side heart failure but are ineffective when both chambers collapse.

"This is an historic event," he said. "For the first time in Israel, we can offer a lifesaving solution for those whose entire heart has failed. This is the first time in Israel that a device has completely replaced the heart. This is the future, and it will help save countless lives by bridging the dangerous waiting period for donor hearts."

Dr. Korach notes that the artificial heart will provide the patient with at least two full, high-quality years of life as he awaits a human heart transplant.

"In summary," said Prof. Amir, "this was a meticulously planned operation executed by a large, harmonized team working with incredible precision. Thanks to the cardiologists, surgeons, heart-lung technicians, anesthesiologists, intensive care experts, nurses and everyone involved, we've given a patient who lived in suffering a brand-new lease on life."

Simone Wilker, Advocacy Chair for Hadassah Southeastern Region, explains, "My oldest son needed a heart transplant. We waited and waited for a new heart; all the while his health deteriorated. After two years of hanging on, with nothing more the doctors could do for him, a nurse walked into his hospital room and told him to stop eating his dinner. She told him that he was going to surgery in a few hours to finally receive a heart. I thank G-d for giving my son this precious gift."

TISHA B'AV

As the nine days before Tisha B' Av began this year, the war in Israel continues to escalate and images since October 7th flash before our eyes. For this we weep, as we approach Tisha B'Av, the saddest day in the Jewish calendar. It's not just the day when our beloved Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed, it was also the day that we lost the center of our nation's heart. The space that connected us to ourselves, to each other and to God. And the pain of that disconnection has been part of each of us since that day. Many of us don't know who we are or what we truly value anymore. We distract ourselves in hundreds of ways every day.

The days leading up to Tisha B'Av are an opportune time to reflect on who we are and what we want out of life. It is a time to face the pain of feeling disconnected so we can start to reconnect with our goals and our values. It is a time to learn more about our Jewish identities and where they fit into our lives. We focus on our differences instead of what unites us. We judge each other harshly and are slow to forgive. We message each other instead of talking.

The week before Tisha B'Av is a time to pause and become aware of how disconnected we are from each other. It is a time to focus on what unites us as a nation instead of what divides us. It is a time to reach out for help if you need it and to give help when you see someone in need. It is a time to let go of our judgments and forgive those who have hurt us. It is a time to notice the people around us and to talk to each other more often. It is a time to think of how isolated we can easily become if we don't work on re-connecting with each other. This is a time to find a space to pray again, to reconnect with the miniature temple within each of our hearts where we feel close to our life's purpose.

As the images from October 7 flash before us, we weep. And we also weep for the painful disconnection that is at the heart of all of our grief.

Tisha B'Av begins sundown on August 2nd and ends sunset on August 3rd. We wish you a heartfelt and meaningful Tisha B'Av.
