





### Hadassah's Etz Aviv Group 25th Birthday

Hadassah's Etz Aviv Group celebrated its 25th Birthday on Sunday, October 5, 2025, at Reunion Kitchen & Bar in Marietta. The focus of the event was to honor all our members, whose commitment led us through these years. Each member participated in a candle lighting ceremony. The presentation ended with everyone pledging their continued commitment to Hadassah's aims and purposes.

In August, 1999, about a dozen women, ranging in age from their 20s to 60s, met to discuss the possible formation of a Hadassah group in the northwest Cobb County area. It was a wonderful experience, unique to most of us, to be in a room with Jewish women only, and the feeling of Sisterhood was immediately evident.

The seeds were planted regarding a new Hadassah Chapter. The idea took root and began to sprout into a tree – a "Tree of Spring" – Etz Aviv. Etz Aviv had a major milestone event in 2013 honoring its Bat Mitzvah year, and then in 2016 the group celebrated its Sweet 16 Birthday. This October the life cycle event was a 25th Birthday party.


Adrienne Clayman, Etz Aviv Past President explains, "We are Hadassah volunteers, performing mitzvahs in our homes, our communities, throughout the world, and especially in Israel, by doing - not saying; by action - not apathy.

A member of the current Etz Aviv Presidium, Faith Shatzman says, "Our tree continues to grow. Its canopy embraces all our Hadassah members, and the members nurture our Tree with Commitment."

With nearly 300,000 global members, Hadassah brings women together to effect change on such critical issues as ensuring Israel's security, combating antisemitism, and promoting women's health care. Hadassah's hospitals serve without regard to race, religion, or nationality, and in 2005 earned a Nobel Peace Prize nomination for building bridges to peace through medicine.

### **ISRAELI HOSTAGE UPDATE**

In response to the release of the remaining 20 living hostages illegally held by Hamas terrorists, Carol Ann Schwartz, National President of Hadassah, The Women's Zionist Organization of America, released the following statement: "Today we rejoice that the remaining 20 living hostages have finally been freed and reunited with their families. We recognize they have a challenging physical and mental rehabilitation process ahead and we embrace them as they work to reclaim their lives. Our joy is tempered as we share in the deep sorrow of the bereaved families who await their loved ones killed in captivity. May our collective strength and love hold them. "For over two years, we have prayed and advocated for the safety and freedom of the men, women and children who were kidnapped by Hamas on October 7, 2023. We have celebrated every hostage release. We have wept and grieved for those murdered. And we have held our breath waiting for every last one to be returned." Currently, Hamas has released the bodies of thirteen hostages, who were held in Gaza for the past two years. The truce deal is stalled as Hamas claims it has not been able to reach the remains of the remaining 15 who are buried beneath the rubble. Teams from Egypt and the International Red Cross have been allowed to search for the bodies beyond the so-called "yellow line" in the area controlled by Israeli forces in Gaza.

"Today, we exhale, though we cannot do so fully until all 48 hostages are back in Israel. Our hearts are with all who have suffered terrible loss, the survivors, whose spirit and resilience have been a miracle, and the hostage families who have been unflinching in their fight to bring them all home.

Hadassah thanks our leaders in the United States, in Israel and around the globe, as well as the negotiators for pushing for an end to this nightmare.

We look ahead with hope to the healing and recovery of the people of Israel and to the promise of peace."

### Hadassah Greater Atlanta Recognizes Breast Cancer Awareness Month

This October, Hadassah Greater Atlanta recognized Breast Cancer Awareness Month. More than 300,000 women in the United States are diagnosed with breast cancer every year. Hadassah members and associates recently learned about Hadassah's breast cancer center at Hadassah's Sharett Institute of Oncology. This center is headed by Dr. Paluch-Shimon. She is a pioneer in empowering women to make informed choices throughout their deeply personal breast cancer journeys.

Dr. Paluch-Shimon is an international expert on breast cancer and the first Israeli to serve as an editor for the Clinical Practice Guidelines committee of the European Society for Medical Oncology (ESMO). Hadassah's Sharett Institute of Oncology models Dr. Paluch-Shimon's vision of empowered, integrated holistic care. Patients are supported by a dedicated nurse coordinator who guides them through the maze of appointments, tests and treatments prescribed by a team of surgeons, oncologists, radiologists, psychologists, social workers, and other specialists. This personalized psychosocial support helps patients make decisions in line with their values and goals.

Dr. Paluch-Shimon tells the story about a young woman who had early-stage breast cancer and transferred to Hadassah after her oncologist elsewhere told her to enjoy her three children and quit dreaming of a fourth. "We judged that a planned and appropriately timed pregnancy was possible and safe for her," Dr. Paluch-Shimon said of this patient. "We temporarily stopped her hormone therapy and ten months later the patient safely delivered a beautiful little boy."

Rosalie Agrow, President of the Hadassah Greater Atlanta Ketura Group explains, "We learned that treatment at Hadassah's Sharett Institute of Oncology is tailored not only to the biology of each patient's disease but also to her personal story. The clinical battle, involving surgery, radiation, chemotherapy, immunotherapy, hormonal or biological therapy, is only one aspect of coping with cancer."

Hadassah urges everyone to tell their lawmakers to improve access to breast cancer treatment, which in turn saves lives. Congress is considering several bipartisan bills: Access to Breast Cancer Diagnosis Act (H.R. 3037 & S. 1500), Metastatic Breast Cancer Access to Care Act (H.R. 2048), EARLY Act Reauthorization (H.R. 4541 & S. 2339), and Find it Early Act (S. 1410).
