

# SCHOOL GROUP GUIDELINES

## For all Teachers and Adult Supervisors

Accompanying adults are responsible for providing active supervision of the students in their group. 'Active Supervision' means in close proximity to their group at all times and able to provide immediate assistance or direction.

The Weird & Wonderful, Pou Kanohi and Pou Maumahara galleries are bookable spaces. Self-guided visits might not have access to all parts of these galleries if learning programmes are taking place.

Please be aware that other school groups are also booked into the Museum galleries. Please move quietly around other groups, especially if an educator session is in progress.

Food, drink, large bags and backpacks must not be taken into the gallery spaces. For breaks and lunch we recommend you enjoy the Auckland Domain. In the case of wet weather please see Museum staff for alternative arrangements.

Students should exhibit appropriate behaviour for a museum visit. We request students to walk only and speak in a quiet inside voice. No running as we have hard granite stairs and hard floor surfaces. The corners of displays and the wall surrounding the void in Levels 1 and 2 in the Grand Foyer are clearly dangerous should students climb onto them or drop objects from them.

When writing or doing sketches please do not lean against any glass cases or internal walls.


Upon arrival you will be asked to fill out a sign in sheet. This will help us keep track of numbers and know how many people are in the building.




