- TEX Project updates
 - Reviewing finalized Project Description/request for Volunteer Scientist
 - Reaching out to networks to identify experts who might be interested
- Arundo removal project update (Bob)
 - Going to be long project
 - Generally small patches
 - Working with contractor to knock them out as opportunities arise
 - Bob spoke to Civicorps today
 - Civicorps' client often call off work at last minute, Arundo work could help fill in their work schedule
 - Jamie: funding from MRC - working on grant application, Bob has provided budgeting ideas
 - Bob: Civicorps would like to get their staff trained to get QAC's (Qualified Applicator Certificates), FOAC would like to help with this effort
 - Igor asked what Civicorps does
 - Bob: vegetation management, removing problem trees
 - Ryan: they helped remove garbage at Rodeo Laurel Court Garden
 - The Council engaged in a long discussion of
- Local Community Benefits Fund - reviewing funding guidelines and brainstorming potential projects
 - Evan shared links and went through the Call for Projects for Benicia and Grant Guidelines
 - Discussed living levee
 - Potential partnerships - CCRCD, Civicorps

- Planning for future requests for projects
 - Bob mentioned LACWMP, implementing it through these recent funding opportunities
 - Evan mentioned that is what the WCB grant plan is about
 - Trevor - one idea for partnership is focus on transportation planning with City, traffic plans, etc.
 - Creek follows major transportation routes
 - Has seen great integration of bike paths, etc. with green stormwater infrastructure

- How could Council and Friends partner with City on something they are already focused on (active transportation, pedestrian safety)?
 - Multi benefits - reducing vehicle miles, GSI, etc all combined
- Jamie: John Muir walking trail - trail connection to Briones
 - City has survey about improvement to parks, including Alhambra Hills Open Space
 - Can fill out survey, vocalize that you want trail connection to Briones
 - Igor: trail connection between City lands, NPS lands, EPRPD lands would require interdepartmental cooperation that the Council is well versed in
- Jamie: any ideas for future agenda items? Project List would be good
