Welcome, as we begin the final chapters of Paul's letter to the Ephesians...

In the first half of the letter, Paul shows us who we are in Christ. In these final chapters, he shows us how to live it out. Ephesians 4–6 is about walking differently, loving differently, and standing firm as followers of Jesus.

We are pairing this journey with the season of Lent (18th Feb – 2nd April) — a time to slow down, reflect, and make space for God to shape us. Alongside these notes, you'll be invited into a simple daily rhythm of Scripture, prayer, and practice to help carry what we learn on Sundays into everyday life.

Reminder on how to approach Bible discovery:

- Before you meet:**
- Find the passage of scripture.
 - Copy it out.
 - Then pray, think and ask God what he is saying to you.
 - Then rewrite the passage in your own words.

Bible discovery study:

1. Pray for help.
2. One person reads the passage.
3. Then take it in turns to read out your own versions of the passage.
4. Then discuss.
5. For each person consider the application. Ask:
 - What grabbed your attention in the passage?
 - Was there anything you particularly liked in the passage?
 - Was there anything that bothered you in the passage?
 - What does this passage say about God?
 - What does this passage say about us?
 - If this is God speaking, what are you going to do about it?
 - Who can you share with this week what God is doing in your life?
