Today our Bible story comes from 1 Samuel 16:1-13. Did you know that the Bible is made up of two testaments, or sections? Today we are in the Old Testament, which is the first section of the Bible, and we are talking about a man named Samuel. Samuel was a very special man who was given a very important job. God gave Samuel an aha moment when God showed Samuel how God knows every detail. Say, "God knows every detail!" (God knows every detail!) Let's look at what happens! AHA I AM KNOWN

DISCUSS & DISCOVER

1. God gave Samuel the reminder that He does not judge by what we see on the outside. Do you think it's easier to judge by what we see on the outside or to try and know what is on the inside—like God does—and why? *(Answers will vary. Guide kids to understand that what we see on the outside is not always true to what is on the inside. We decide who a person is based on what we see, but God knows who we are based on our hearts.)*
2. God sees what is on the inside—what's going on in our minds and hearts. He knows people for who we really are, sin and all, and He still sent Jesus to save us so we could be forgiven. How can it help you to know that Jesus loves and forgives us, even though He knows every detail about us—both the good and the bad?
3. Sometimes we can feel invisible. How can today's Bible story help when we feel that way? *(We can remember that we are known by God; We can know that God knows every detail about us; We can know that God sees our hearts and He loves us.)*

Pray: God, thank You for helping us learn about how You know every detail about us, and how much You love and care about us. Nothing in our lives is hidden from You. Remind us of this truth whenever we might forget that You care for us. Amen.
