

Foundation Programme

Thank you for your interest in our new Foundation Programme.

This pathway allows families to raise their future autism assistance dog at home, supported every step of the way by our training and welfare team.

Please note: This programme is not for training dogs or puppies you already own.

Autism Dogs Charity will carefully source and deliver a puppy to your home within 6 weeks of enrolment, ensuring the best chance of a successful partnership.



Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for the program, applicants must meet all of the following:

- **Diagnosis**: The applicant must have an official diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).
- Age: Applicants must be at least 4 years old.
- Location: Applicants must permanently reside in mainland England, Scotland, or Wales and be available to attend monthly in-person training sessions at our venues.
- **Health**: The applicant must not have unmanaged epilepsy.
- **Support Network**: The welfare of the dog must be managed by an adult or third party in addition to the handler. Applications where the handler lives alone or lacks a clear network of suitable support cannot be approved.
- **Commitment**: The handler and their family must be able to attend in-person training sessions and be dedicated to maintaining the dog's training and care.
- **Application Accuracy**: All information provided in the application must be truthful and accurate.
- **Allergies**: No members of the applicant's household may have severe allergies to dogs.
- **Existing pets**: Applications will be reviewed on a caseby-case basis if other pet dogs are already in the residence, to ensure compatibility.





Note: Autism Dogs Charity reserves the right to assess whether the Programme will be beneficial for the applicant and if resources are available to accept the application.



Programme Costs

As a charity, Autism Dogs Charity is committed to offering life-changing assistance dogs through a **subsidised costs** model.

The actual cost of the Assistance Dog Programme far exceeds the contribution required from clients. Thanks to fundraising efforts and generous donors, we are able to cover all administrative and operational costs, leaving clients to contribute only a portion of the true expense.

Client Contribution

The total contribution required is £14,990, which is heavily subsidised. This ensures that the programme remains accessible while covering key elements such as dog training, therapeutic support, and aftercare services.

Payment Structure

To make the contribution manageable, payments are structured as follows:

- Deposit: £4,000 This initial payment is required only upon acceptance into the programme. It secures your place and initiates the profiling and preparation process, marking the first step in your journey with Autism Dogs Charity.
- Second Instalment: £10,990 on delivery of the puppy. This instalment reflects the
 extensive investment in dog training, family training, and support services provided up
 to this stage.

Why is there a cost?

Although we are a charity, providing assistance dogs involves a considerable financial commitment. Each dog is carefully selected, trained, and supported to meet the unique needs of its handler. Additionally, our Programme includes:

- Professional training for both the dog and family.
- Psychotherapy and therapeutic support.
- Comprehensive aftercare services to ensure long-term success.

Financial accessibility and future opportunities

We are a well-established, accredited charity. If the financial contribution isn't manageable at this time, we recommend holding off on your application. You're welcome to revisit in future, as we continue working to lower costs through ongoing fundraising.

- · The applicant's permanent residence is in mainland England, Scotland, or Wales.
- The applicant does not have unmanaged epilepsy.
- · The applicant information given is correct and truthful.
- We feel that the Programme will be beneficial to the applicant.
- The welfare of the dog is fully managed by an adult or 3rd party in addition to the handler (we are unable to agree to a dog living with a handler living alone or without a clear network of suitable support).
- · We feel that the dog's welfare and needs would be met.
- · There would be someone to care for the dog during the day.
- · We feel that the team has the relevant expertise for all of the applicant's conditions.
- · The applicant is able to attend the in-person interview appointment on the date required.
- · No members of the applicant's residence have severe dog allergies.
- We have the resources to accept the application (sometimes we receive more applications that fulfil the rest of the criteria than we have the resources to enrol at one time).
