A Unique Museum for the Whole Family

The Museum of Wonder & Delight, located in Historic Folsom, California, is a one-of-a-kind cultural attraction for all ages, providing a museum experience unlike any other in the region or state.

The Creative Director and Curator of the museum is Dolph Gotelli, who is an internationally renowned collector and lecturer on the subject of play, childhood toys and games, as well as celebrations and rituals, including his expertise on all aspects of Christmas.

The museum features intriguing 19th and 20th century toys, global folk art, ephemera, ornaments, games, dolls, books, and more from Gotelli's vast collection. Creative displays accentuate the whimsical and entertaining aspects of the pieces that are sure to captivate and delight.

Once Upon a Time and Christmas Dreams are the two permanent galleries that showcase Gotelli's collections. Exquisite vignettes, filled with mesmerizing displays of antique, toys, figures, and artifacts, are arranged in Gotelli's story telling, awe-inspiring, signature style. A third gallery features rotating exhibits of unusual and rare toy and folk art collections brought in from all parts of the country. The museum gift shop offers unique items, including some specially selected pieces from Gotelli's own collection.

Various educational programs and special events offered at the museum also support Gotelli's goal to "inspire and rekindle the imagination".

The museum, one of three sponsored by the Folsom Historical Society, is conveniently located in the space adjacent to the Folsom Historic District parking structure at 905 Leidesdorff Street, Folsom, CA 95630. About Dolph Gotelli

A curator, designer, and artist, DOLPH GOTELLI navigates a broad range of disciplines, developing his ideas through object-based installations. In contrast to many collectors, Dolph feels the importance to display his collections for the enjoyment of others. He has displayed his collections with a myriad of themes to create new visions and connections with his whimsical artifacts, including toys, international folk art, and traditional objects used in international festivals and celebrations.

An international expert and lecturer on the subjects of Christmas, holiday rituals, and Santa Claus, Dolph's exhibitions have documented design in cultures around the world.

As professor emeritus of Design at the University of California at Davis, where he taught for 35 years, Dolph's enthusiasm for cultivating the creative spirit and promoting fantasy to solve problems consistently filled his design classes and public presentations. As Director and Founder of the Design Museum at the University of California at Davis, he was responsible for developing the national reputation of the gallery as an innovative and dynamic space that is on the cutting edge of presenting themed exhibitions from a global perspective.

Dolph has designed and installed major displays in retail settings such as Neiman Marcus and Macy's, and in museums including the Museum of Arts and Design in New York, Los Angeles Craft and Folk Art Museum and Canadian Craft Museum in Vancouver, BC.

His groundbreaking exhibition, *The Santa Show*, at the Crocker Art Museum in Sacramento in 1977-1978 was a catalyst that energized Santa collecting throughout the United States.

Dolph's work has been published in The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, The Los Angeles Times, Newsweek, Smithsonian, and more. He has appeared on national television and radio shows, and lectures nationally and internationally on his areas of expertise.

He is also the author of the book *Wonder & Delight,* A *Dolph Gotelli Christmas*, which documents his collections, exhibitions and installations.
