Greetings Santa Clara Community,

As I enter my fifth year as the City of Santa Clara’s City Manager, I am excited to share some of the highlights and many accomplishments that our City team has completed this year. Also, I want to acknowledge the dedicated City staff and City Council that serve the community of Santa Clara. As we have shared before, while dealing with the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, the City continued to provide essential City services while also pivoting and delivering new programs that the community desperately needed. Through our City team’s commitment and hard work, the City has received multiple recognitions and awards for the essential programs and services provided to the community.

In February 2021, the City Council met for the 2021 Priority Setting Session to discuss the City’s priorities and reaffirm its existing strategic pillars. The Council unanimously determined that the highest priority was the City’s COVID-19 response and recovery programs. **I have included a few highlights on the page below.**

As the year closes, I wanted to share with the community our efforts to advance the City Council’s priorities and all that we have accomplished this year, in addition to our many COVID response and recovery programs.

Most notably, the City was challenged by COVID-induced fiscal impacts by a slowed global and regional economy.

Our strategic financial management of nearly \$5 billion of resources and assets helped us keep a steady hand during budget reduction deliberations and support the Council’s strong leadership with making decisions to preserve services. As stated before, the City had to solve a 42-million-dollar COVID-induced fiscal deficit. City Council and staff worked hard to balance a two-year budget; however, a 17.6-million-dollar ongoing fiscal deficit remains. In February 2022, we will provide an update of the City’s fiscal outlook.

Even with the challenges of the pandemic, the City of Santa Clara was able to deliver many capital improvement projects, such as the completion of the Reed & Grant Sports Park, several park playground rehabilitation projects, construction of approximately 4,000 linear feet of water mains, and the installation of traffic improvement projects such as flashing beacons and speed bumps – all to better serve our Santa Clara residents.

On behalf of our City team, we believe it is an honor to serve Santa Clara, and this report demonstrates our continued commitment. I am proud of the work my team and I do every day to support and implement the City Council’s goals and priorities and deliver a broad range of services to keep the community thriving. Together, the community and City workforce has shown their resilience and commitment to making Santa Clara “The Center of What’s Possible.” Thank you for the opportunity to serve as Santa Clara’s City Manager!

City Budget of Santa Clara

In June 2021, the City of Santa Clara adopted the biennial operating budget for the two-year period, July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2023, totaling \$1.06 billion in FY 2021/22 and \$1.14 billion in FY 2022/23. This budget, which funds all City services and activities, is supported by a variety of revenues, such as user fees, local property and sales tax, revenue from other agencies, licenses and permits, rent and

interest on investments, and other sources. This budget was adopted at a challenging time as the City addressed a shortfall resulting from COVID-19 impacts on City revenues. In addition, adjustments were made to the FY 2021/22 capital budget, which totals \$337.4 million. Information about current and previous budgets can be found at SantaClaraCa.gov/Finance.

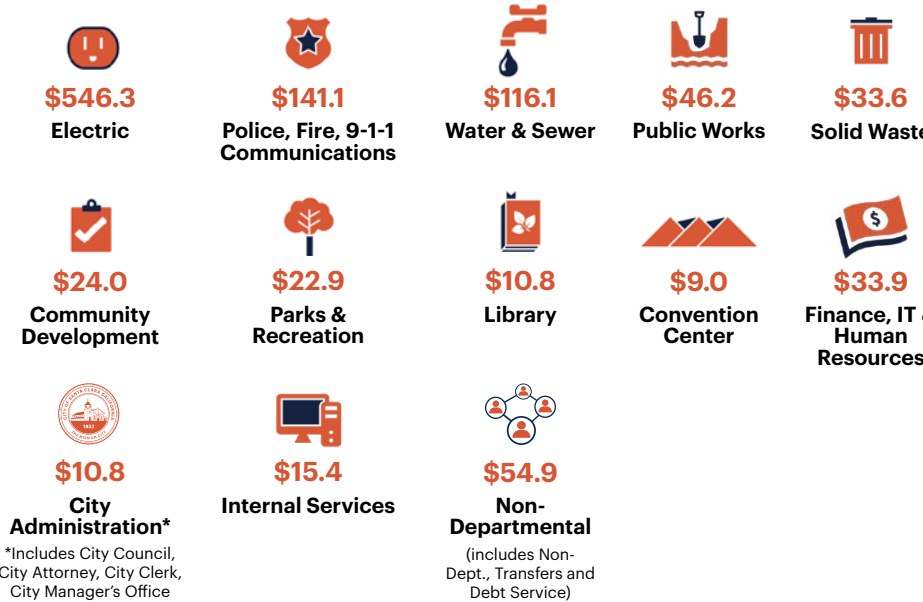

What you should know about property tax and sales tax

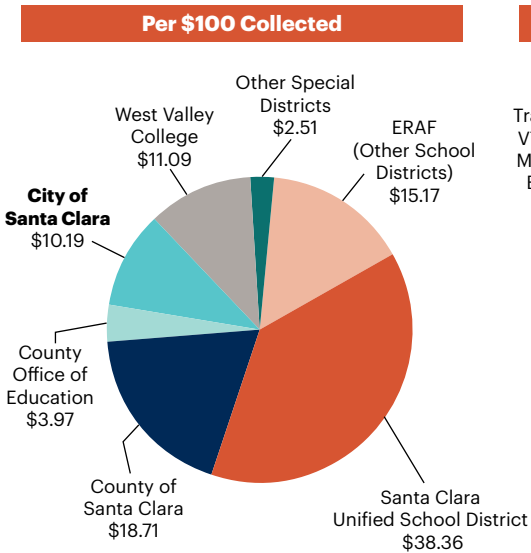
Although they are both important sources of revenue, only a small portion of property tax and sales tax goes to the City of Santa Clara.

- The City of Santa Clara receives \$10.19 of every \$100 collected in property tax.
- The City of Santa Clara receives \$1 of every \$9 of sales tax collected.

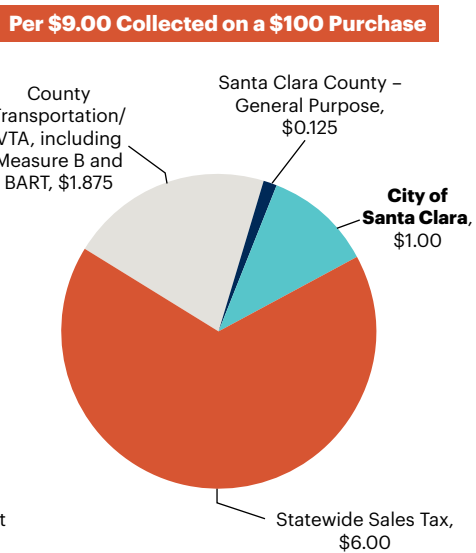
How the City's Annual Operating Budget is allocated (\$ in millions)

Annual Cleanup Campaign is May 2 - May 27, 2022

The Cleanup Campaign is a service for the residents of the City of Santa Clara, not for people from other communities, contractors or businesses.
Call 408-615-3080 weekdays or 408-615-5580 after 4:30 p.m. or on weekends to report illegal dumping in progress.
DO NOT set out your materials before the specified dates. Early set-outs are subject to a **\$150 fine**.

DO NOT block driveways, sidewalks or bike lanes.

Place materials only in front of your address and at least 3 feet from any obstructions such as fire hydrants, fences, poles, cars, trees, bushes or walls.
Avoid parking on the street during your collection week.

Not all developments participate in the Cleanup Campaign. Check map to confirm correct set out times. Unsure about your area or where to place your items? Contact 408-615-3080.

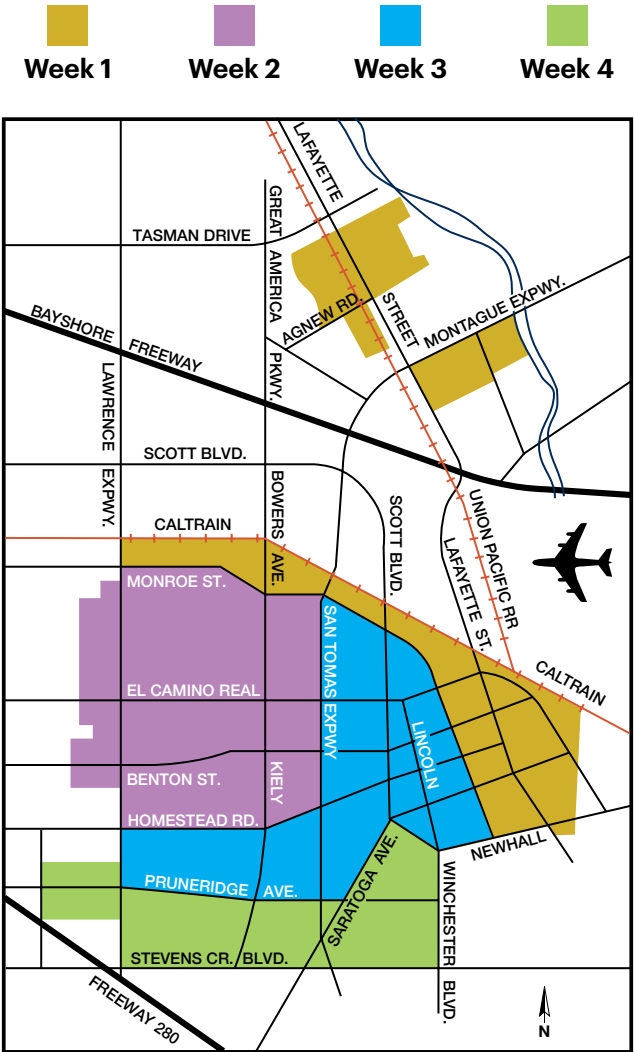
ACCEPTED MATERIALS

- Bulky items such as old furniture, carpets, mattresses, toilets, foam packaging, etc.
- Appliances, tires, e-waste (anything that requires a plug or battery to operate), untreated lumber, branches and brush (no longer than 6 feet in length). **Separate each of these types of materials for special collection.**
- All** concrete, asphalt, dirt, brick, rocks, drywall and/or sawdust **MUST** be set out in a heavy duty bulk bag no larger than 1 cubic yard to prevent potential stormwater runoff pollution. Failure to use a bulk bag for these items is subject to a \$150 fine. Bulk bags may be purchased at a retailer of your choice or through Utility Services for \$22.26 each starting April 4. Contact Utility Services at 408-615-2300 to purchase and for pickup information. A total of 1 cubic yard of bagged debris will be picked up at no charge. Additional bagged cubic yards will be assessed at \$25/cubic yard.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

- Pressure treated wood** waste such as fence posts, railroad ties and decking must be managed as **hazardous waste** and will **not be collected**.
- Contractor-generated** landscape or construction/demolition debris.
- Household hazardous waste** such as paint, chemicals, automotive fluids, solvents, fertilizers, cleaning products, compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), batteries or sharps. Illegal set-out of hazardous materials is subject to a \$500 fine.
Visit **HHW.org** or call the County Household Hazardous Waste Program at 408-299-7300 to schedule a FREE drop-off appointment.
- Biohazardous waste** or biomedical waste such as diapers, sanitary napkins, sharps and syringes, human and animal waste, and any other infectious materials.
- Ammunition and explosives.** For safe disposal, call the Santa Clara Police Department at 408-615-5580.
- Medications.** Safely dispose of expired or unwanted medications at the MED-Project kiosks located throughout the City. For additional information and a list of locations, visit **SCCMEDS.org**.
