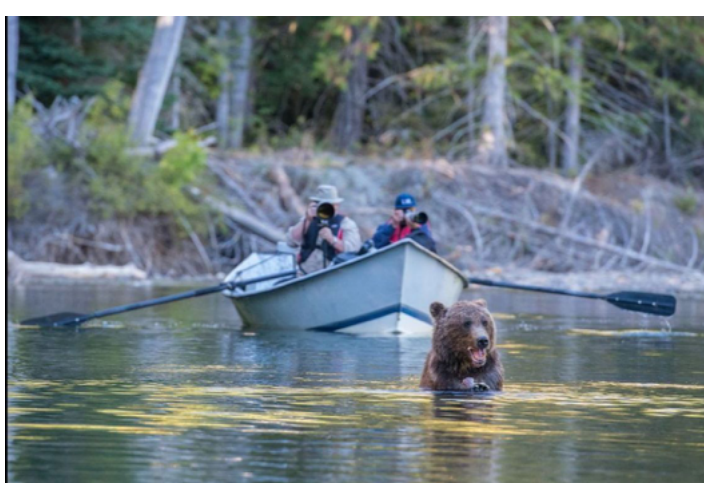

The report offers a more in-depth look at presentations shared by expert speakers and of select peer-to-peer sessions where business leaders shared concerns and challenges in climate strategy implementation, and sought advice from one another.

Sustainable Aviation Fuel and Carbon Removal News



- ClimeFi has released a [new report](#) analyzing carbon removal market data from the first quarter of 2025. It shows a steady market growth with a 32% increase evident in a year-on-year comparison of Q1 2024.
- TikTok and Two Drifters Distillery signed on with Climeworks to remove over 6,000 tons of carbon dioxide. Climeworks will support TikTok with a portfolio that includes Direct Air Capture, Biochar, and Reforestation, and continue its collaboration with Two Drifters focused on Direct Air Capture technology. Climeworks is a longtime Tomorrow's Air supplier and says the deals highlight the growing demand for carbon removal solutions across different industries.
- Eion, Tomorrow's Air enhanced rock weathering supplier, secures \$33m carbon removal offtake deal with Frontier. Frontier is a \$1 billion+ advance market commitment to purchase permanent carbon removal by 2030, established by McKinsey, Alphabet, Meta, Shopify, and Stripe.
- Microsoft and International Airlines Group (IAG, the parent company of airlines including Aer Lingus, British Airways, Iberia, Vueling and LEVEL) are extending an agreement for the purchase of Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF). Microsoft is using the SAF purchase to reduce emissions from its business travel and air freight. The SAF funded by the agreement will be produced from used cooking oil and food waste at Phillips 66's UK-based Humberside refinery, and from sustainably-sourced bioethanol at Georgia-based LanzaJet's Freedom Pines Fuels.
