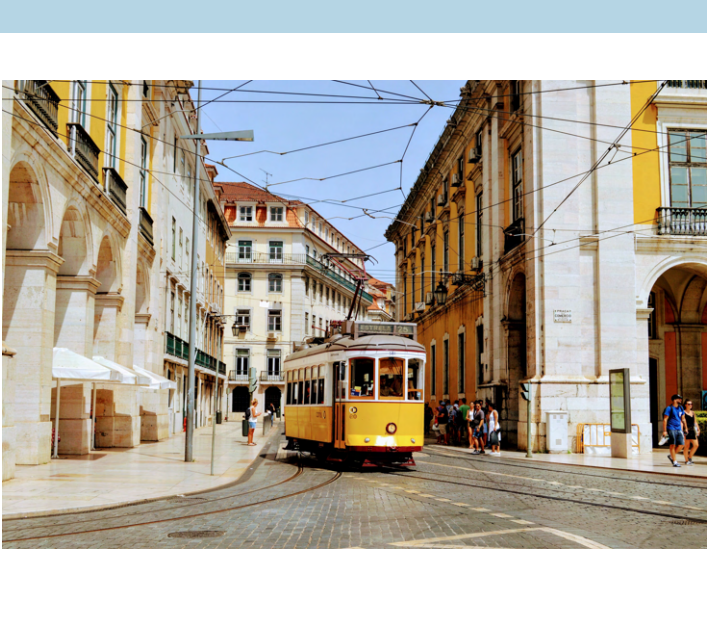

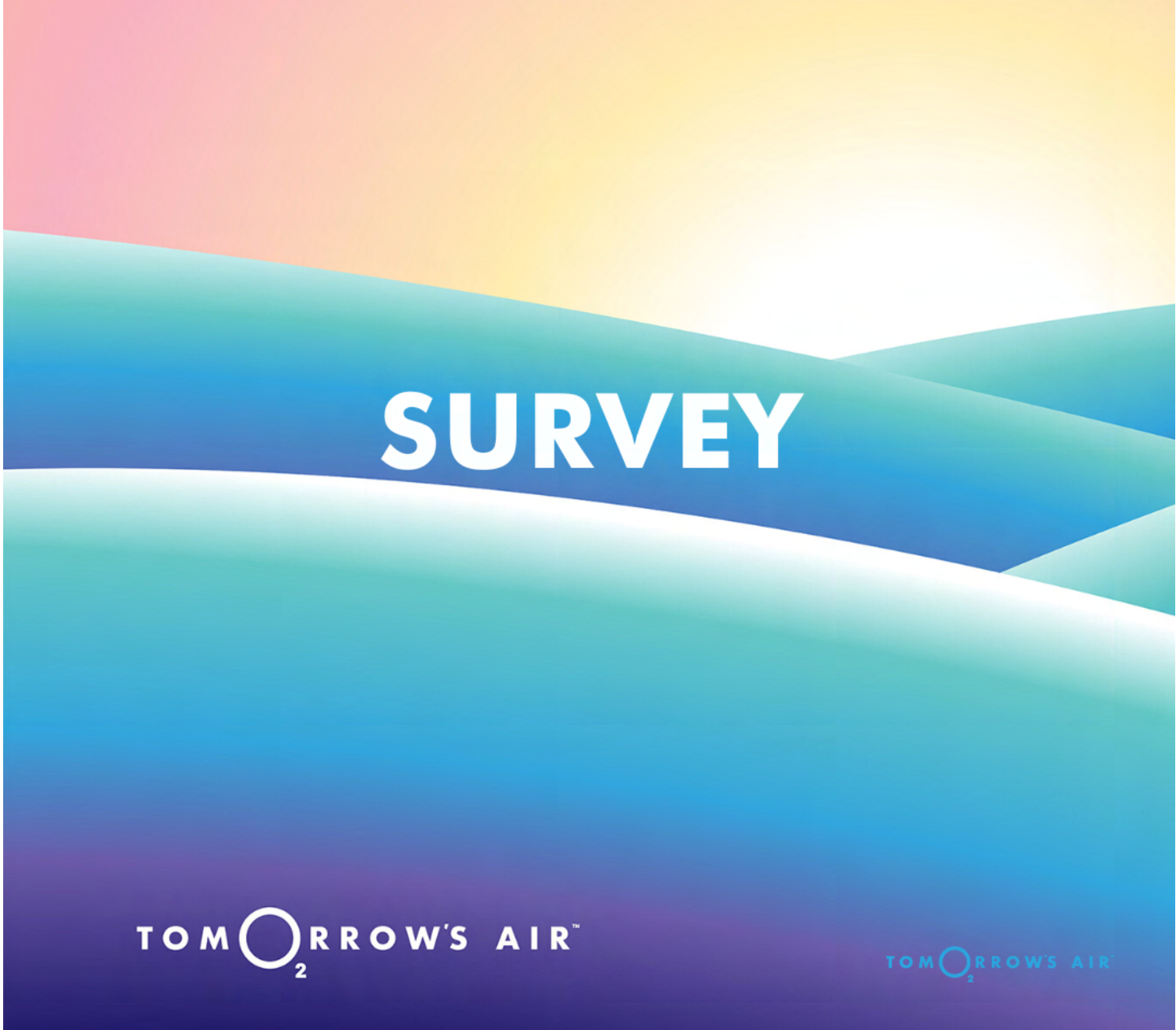
Eating Better When We Travel

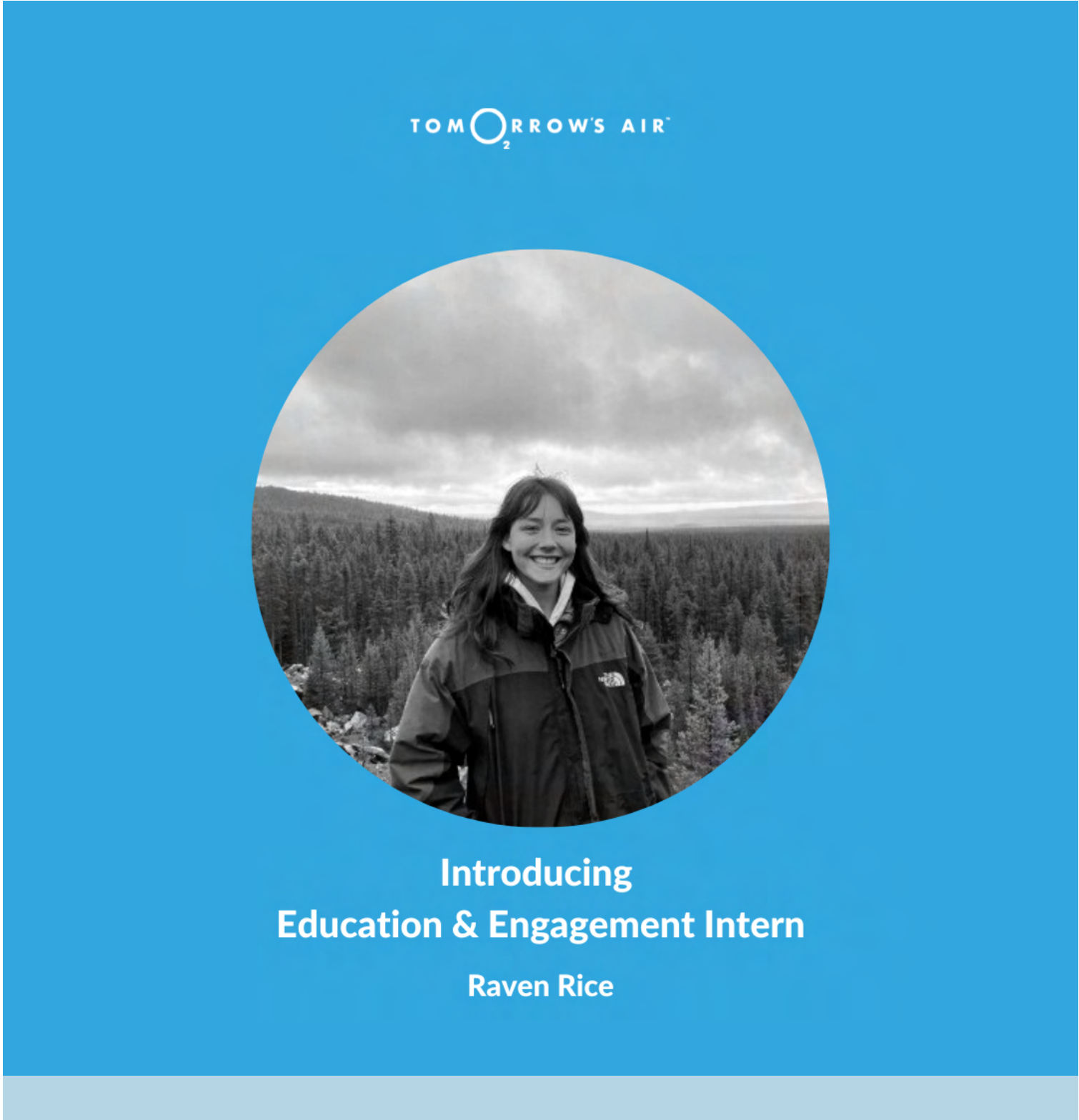
Share Your Thoughts on Climate and Travel

Meet Raven Rice, Education & Engagement Intern

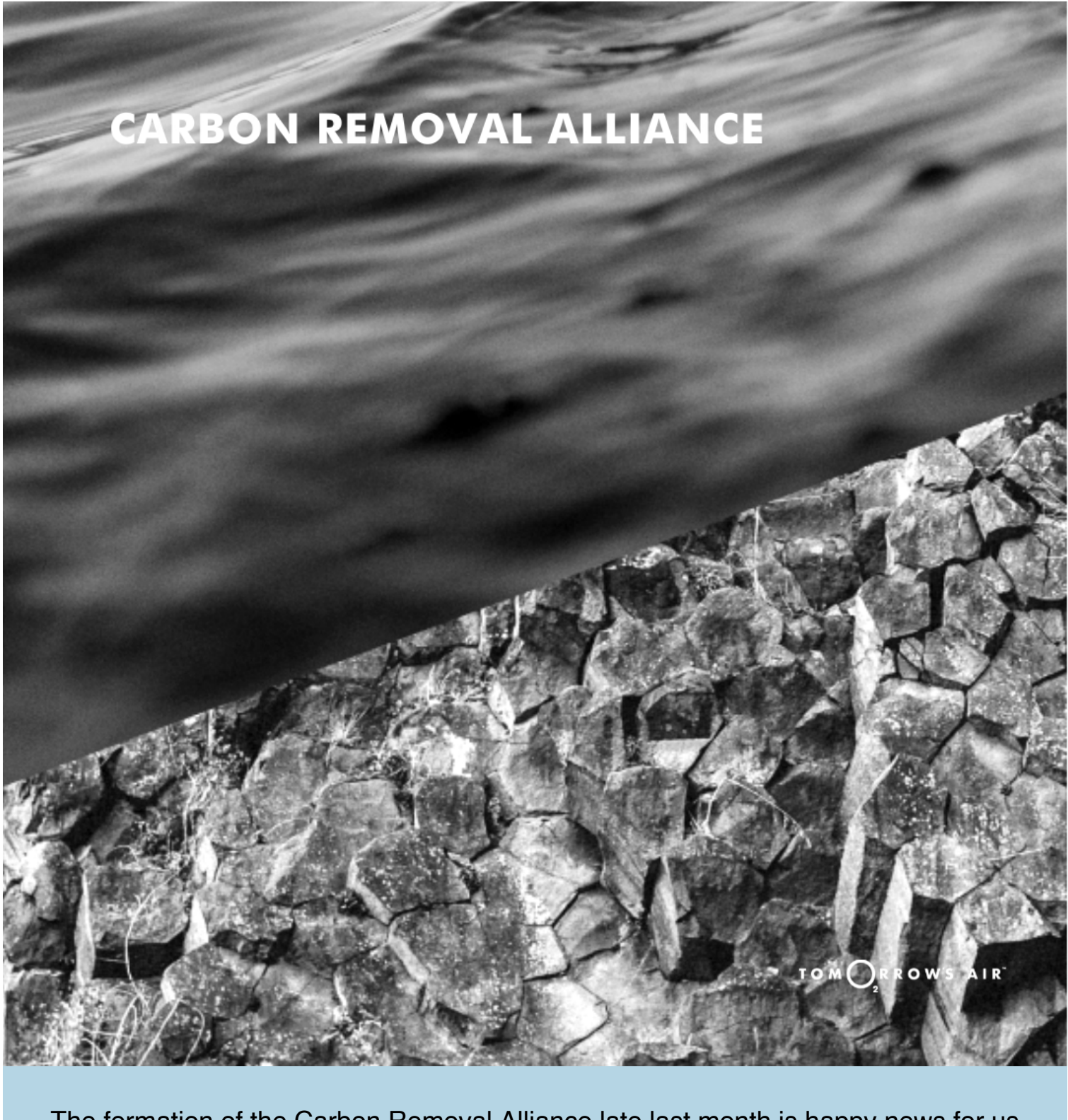
