Sites of the 1955-1956 Montgomery Bus Boycott

- **Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church** and **Dexter Parsonage** | Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. led the Congregation from 1954 to 1960

Sites of the 1965 March from Selma to Montgomery

- Crossing the **Edmund Pettus Bridge** in Selma
- The Catholic **City of St Jude**
- Meet with a 1965 "Foot Soldier" and life-long **Civil Rights Activist**

Understand the connection between the history of slavery and racial terror, and the modern-day system of mass incarceration and capital punishment.

- **The Legacy Museum:** From Enslavement to Mass Incarceration
- **The National Memorial for Peace and Justice:** A sacred space for truth telling and reflection about lynching and its legacy
- The **Freedom Monument Sculpture Park**, honoring the lives of the 10 million Black people who were enslaved in America
- Meet with staff from **Equal Justice Initiative**

Pray and discern how Catholics can play a more active role in truth-telling to move our nation towards justice and healing.

- Encounters with local ministries may include: **Resurrection Catholic Missions** of the South and the **Edmundite Missions**
- Mass, group prayer and meditation times
- In-depth sharing times with fellow parishioners
