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ARTIST STATEMENT

Court Eldridge is an interdisciplinary artist working across staged photography, writing, and research-based practice. Her work examines documentation as a site of power—how images, language, and institutional systems determine what is preserved, minimized, or erased. Grounded in feminist theory, disability studies, and lived experience, her practice treats the body as archive and evidence rather than spectacle. Eldridge's work is process-driven and investigative, emphasizing ethical authorship, consent-based methods, and structural clarity over finished display. Her current practice is focused on research, writing, and project development toward future exhibition formats.
