Effective from 4 July 2025 ANZ Staff Banking has updated the financial products and services that extend benefits for retired officers with 30 years' service or more. To access these benefits Retired Officers must call the Staff Banking phone line (1800 269 757) and follow the prompts for "Retired Officers" to apply for Staff Banking benefits.

Alternatively, Retired Officers can send a query through Internet Banking by selecting 'Mail' once logged in and submitting a "New Enquiry" which will be responded to through Internet Banking. The current financial products and services to which benefits apply are as follows:


WOOD N. E .(NORMAN) 99 YEARS 18/09/2025
