HONE YOUR BUSINESS WITH BORA

Following the end of the native rhinos of Malaysia in 2019, BORA (Borneo Rhino Alliance, www.bringingbackourareanimals.org) has become involved in many wildlife management programmes, involving elephants, wild cattle, orangutans, deer, wild pigs, macaques, feral dogs, plant nurseries and grasslands. Almost all have been either funded by grants or are done free of charge, and all are now unsustainable. We need to source new income. At the same time, we have demonstrable expertise in subjects of interest to people in corporate ESG as well as social enterprises, foresters, oil palm growers and environmental NGOs.

Here are the types of work for which BORA has expertise, and for which we can offer help:

Subject	What we can offer
Seedlings & planting materials of wild native plant species	Provision of seedlings of native trees, strangling figs and / or grasses
Plant nurseries	Advisory, establishment and/or operation of nurseries
Elephants	Establishment and management of pastures and grasslands for wild elephants
Electric fencing	Trouble-shooting and advisory for rural electric fencing (we see that >90% of fences are currently not working due to either poor advice, materials, construction or maintenance)
Native vegetation improvement and restoration with woody plants	Enrichment and recovery of degraded vegetation to attract specific wildlife species away from farms and plantations, and relevant to carbon sequestration and biodiversity enhancement
Pastures	Establishment and management of customised pastures for any grazing species
Animal nutrition	Provision of food and minerals in relation to wildlife management or recovery
