Company Overview

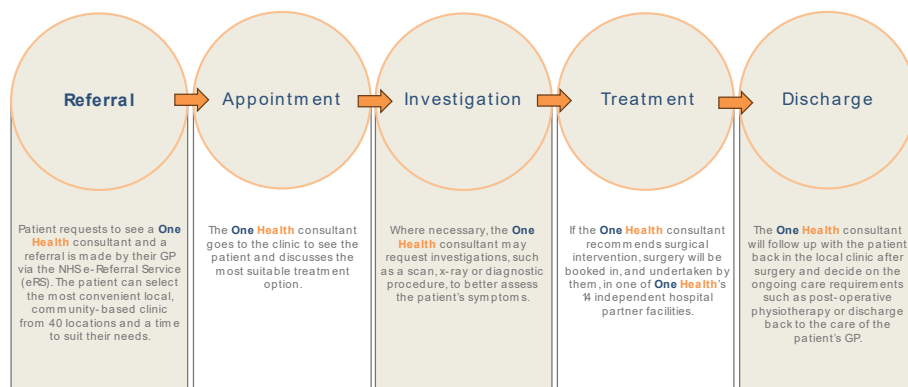
One Health (AIM: OHGR) is an independent provider of clinical care services giving patients local access to NHS-funded procedures through 'Patient Choice' across orthopaedics (most commonly knee and hip replacements), spine, general surgery, gynaecology, and urology. One Health engages 88 NHS Consultants (excluding anaesthetists) who sub-specialise in the various surgeries offered by the Company, through a growing network of community-based outreach clinics and surgical operating locations.

One Health is focused on areas where NHS patient needs are under-supplied by the local NHS service, population density is relatively high and the level of private medical insurance or the ability to self-fund is relatively low. Currently, the Company's activities are focused in Yorkshire, Lincolnshire, Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire and Leicestershire. Revenue is derived from 29 ICBs across England as well as contracts with local NHS trusts to transfer their internal waiting list patients to One Health for quicker treatment.

What is 'Patient Choice'?

Since 2009, NHS patients have had a **statutory right to select One Health as their provider of care** through 'Patient Choice' with all treatment provided free of charge, at **no cost to the patient**, with One Health being funded by the NHS. The NHS e-Referral System (e-RS) allows NHS patients to choose their provider of care from a selection of NHS and independent sector providers as well as the date, time and location of their appointment to suit their availability. GPs may be able to book this e-Referral appointment immediately during the GP appointment. One Health currently has a **wide network of 40 One Health community-based outreach clinics**, offering easy access for patients at a time to suit their needs.

The **Government is actively promoting 'Patient Choice'** and the increased use of the independent sector to tackle very high waiting lists (currently c. 7.1m) and minimise health inequalities, reflected in the [January 2025 NHS - Independent Sector partnership agreement](#).



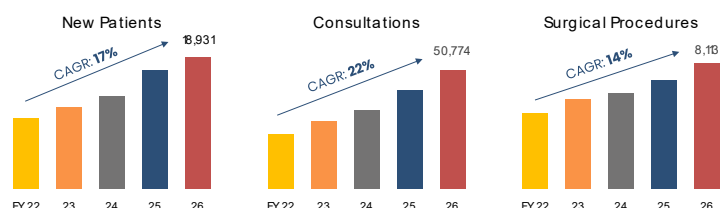
Why patients choose One Health



One Health in numbers

In FY 26, One Health received **18,931 new patient referrals, carried out 50,774 consultations and 8,113 surgical procedures** through 14 independent hospitals. There was a 15% increase in surgical procedures versus FY 25, through expansion with existing providers and the introduction of additional independent sector hospitals. More than 95% of One Health patients came from GP referrals in FY 26, which allows patients to by-pass long NHS waiting lists.

As the Company grows into new geographies, increased awareness of the business model results in more consultants approaching One Health to provide their services. There are currently over 140 NHS consultants and anaesthetists deployed across Yorkshire, Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire and Leicestershire.



Surgical Hub

A significant part of One Health's strategic growth plan to support continuing organic growth is the establishment of a network of Surgical Hubs in critically under-served areas, which will be owned and operated by the Group rather than requiring patients to travel long distances to existing independent facilities within One Health's network. The surgical hub model is characteristic of delivering efficient, high-volume surgeries and is designed to **maximise both patient outcomes and financial returns**. The model is also line with Central Government drive towards geographically separate, community based surgical hubs to reduce pressure on existing NHS infrastructure.

In **February 2026**, construction commenced for One Health's first **Surgical Hub** in Scunthorpe, Lincolnshire. The project is on track to be delivered within the one-year construction period and in line with the previous cost estimate of £8m to £9m.

The surgical hub is expected to deliver **significant additional surgical operating capacity** in regions with limited provision of NHS services. The business is well funded to execute on this plan and has made significant progress in identifying further surgical hub locations. There is **significant scope for strategic growth of £6m+ revenue per surgical hub** and potential for up to **£8-9m in revenue per hub** once fully established.

He founded One Health after leaving the NHS in 2000 in pursuit of a better way of operating through outsourcing services from the NHS. He is recognised as one of the UK's leading knee surgeons and took referrals nationally and internationally including many high-profile athletes.

FY 26 results highlights
