

A Conversation with Dr. Salim Munayer on Israel-Palestine: A Seedbed Symposium

Dr. Salim Munayer is the founder of Musalaha, a ministry pursuing reconciliation between Israelis and Palestinians inside and outside the church. He is a professor at several institutions and former academic dean of Bethlehem Bible College. Dr. Munayer also serves as the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) regional coordinator for the WEA's Peace and Reconciliation Network. He has authored or collaborating on multiple books, including Journey Through the Storm: Lessons from Musalaha Ministry of Reconciliation, The Land Cries Out: Theology of the Land in the Israel-Palestine Context, Seeking and Pursuing Peace: The Process, the Pain, and the Product, the New Creation Book for Muslims, and his most recent publication, Reconciling Justice: Concepts of Justice in the Multireligious Context of Palestine/Israel (Wipf and Stock, 2024).

In the April 2024 issue of *Seedbed*, "Introducing the Prince of Peace to a World at War," editor-in-chief S.T. Antonio wrote a book review of a work co-authored by a Palestinian Christian and Israeli Messianic Jew entitled, *Through My Enemy's Eyes: Envisioning Reconciliation in Israel-Palestine* (Paternoster, 2014). To continue Seedbed's mission of stimulating transformational conversations about high-stakes issues in frontier disciple-making, *Seedbed* hosted a follow-up conversation in July 2024 with Palestinian co-author Dr. Salim Munayer in the first-ever *Seedbed* Symposium.

In this wide-ranging conversation, Dr. Salim told his story of growing up between Jewish and Palestinian communities in the Holy Land, how he got started in reconciliation ministry, and how *Through My Enemy's Eyes* came to be. He shared his take on the roots of the ongoing Israe-



li-Palestinian conflict, the Western Christian response, and his source of hope in dark times.
