#### Agreement Focuses On Developing Rising Tax Law Students Through Paid Fellowships, \$10,000 Scholarships

BALTIMORE - Frost Law and the University of Baltimore School of Law announced today the creation of a special fellowship and scholarship program aimed at students with a concentration in tax law.

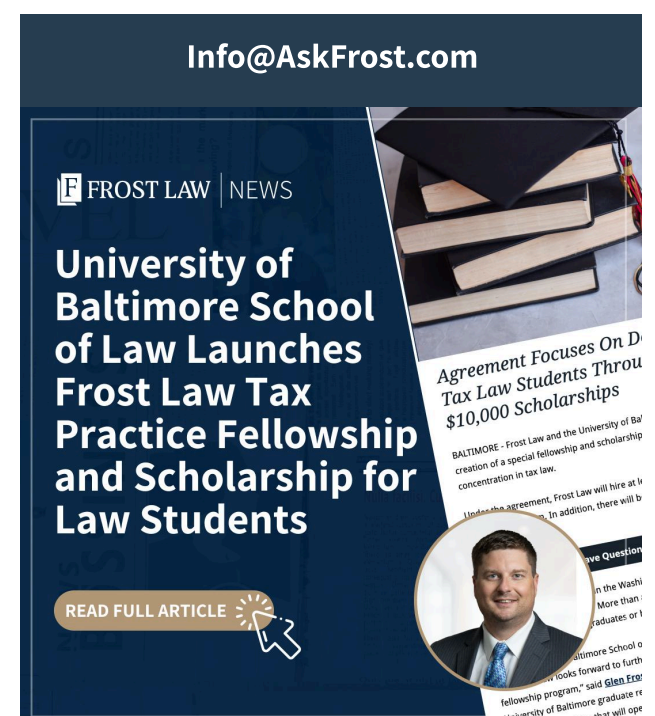
Under the agreement, Frost Law will hire at least two UBalt Law students for a paid summer fellowship program. In addition, there will be \$10,000 scholarships awarded to law school students.

Frost Law is headquartered in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area and has deep ties to the University of Baltimore. More than a dozen current Frost employees are University of Baltimore School of Law graduates or have volunteered through university programs.

“The University of Baltimore School of Law enjoys a history of developing excellent students, and Frost Law looks forward to furthering this tradition through the new scholarship and fellowship program,” said Glen Frost, the firm’s Founder and Managing Partner. The University of Baltimore graduate received a J.D. in 2008 and an LL.M in 2009. “This initiative creates opportunities that will open doors for both students and Frost Law.”

The agreement creates The Frost Law and Tax Practice Scholar Award. Highlights of the new program include:

- Each spring, Frost Law will hire at least two UBalt Law students for a summer fellowship program. The paid fellowships will last at least 10 weeks. Special emphasis will be placed on students with a CPA license, and those pursuing one, but outstanding students in other areas of legal study will be eligible for the fellowships.
- Beginning in the fall of this year, Frost will provide one or two \$10,000 scholarships each year to law students. The University of Baltimore Foundation will administer the fund.
- Currently, the scholarship and fellowship initiative is projected to last at least three years.
