

- 2. The consonant 'm' is doubled before adding -ing.
- 3. Only option 2 has the correct spelling with double 'm'.

Concept Tips

- Notice the triple syllable structure: re-mem-ber.

- 2. It contains three syllables and one 'm' in each cluster.
- 3. Option 2 is the only correct spelling.

Concept Tips

- "They're" is a contraction for "they are."
- "Their" and "there" are different words.
- Look for the apostrophe in contractions.

- 3. Option 3 is the only correct answer.

Concept Tips

- Contractions combine two words using an apostrophe.
- "I'II" is the contraction for "I will."
- "III" without an apostrophe means sick.

- 1. "I'll" is the correct contraction, spelled with an apostrophe between I and II.
- 2. Option 4 means "not well" or "sick".
- 3. Option 2 is the correct usage.
