## Stop 1: Overmarsh Farm Commons

Overmarsh Farm Commons is a Community Agricultural Project in partnership with our local Land Bank and Grange that has benefitted from SJICD Carbon Farm Planning.



## Stop 2: The Farm at Krystal Acres

Featuring a Garry Oak afforestation project, riparian buffer improvements implemented by our Islands Conservation Corps crew, and the cutest alpacas you've ever seen!



## Stop 3: Lime Kiln State Park

Lime Kiln is a popular place for viewing our endangered southern resident killer whales and an iconic island destination with abundant marine life, stunning vistas, and a historic lighthouse- even if the whales don't stop by.



## End: Conservation District Campus

Enjoy a tour of the San Juan Islands Conservation District Campus at 915 Spring Street. Meet our staff and learn about our programs. This is the final stop. Shuttle service back to Friday Harbor Suite will be available, or make it a short walk.
