

Colour in the grown ups who you can go to the farm with.








2. Wear your hi vis vest

The farmer is very busy today. We can visit the farm tomorrow.






### Know your farm signs

#### The Signs

be really bossy here!!!)








#### **Electricity**

The farmer uses electricity in many ways and know they must be very careful. Tick the box under the picture where the farmer uses electricity!











#### **Trips & Falls**


When we visit a farm we must be careful to keep away from places where we could trip and fall. **Discuss in class:** What dangers are these signs warning us about?

We've been out and about on the farm. Can you circle the dangers in the picture below. Are any children in danger of falling?






### What the animals say!


Animals will behave a certain way to let us know how they feel. They will use sounds, their ears and tails. Sometimes they are grumpy and sometimes they are happy.

As a class discuss some of the sounds animals make that tell us how they feel.

### Cows & Bulls

Many farmers keep cows and bulls. Farmers have to be very careful as these animals are not pets and not always friendly. A cow with new calves can be very cross as she is minding her new calves.

**Back - Scared or angry** 







### Hand feeding


If you are feeding a horse a treat, make sure to keep your hand nice and flat!

- Apple pieces
- Carrot pieces
- Polo mints
- Treats bought in equine stores
- Horse nuts / cubes




### Join the dots to see which is the correct way to feed!







Sometimes animals can pass a disease to people. So after touching animals or being on a farm always wash your hands. This makes sure we are healthy.





Get some water, not too hot

Add the soap, quite a lot

Now clean on top and in between

Twist those hands, they're NEARLY clean

Clean each thumb, one by one

Finger-tip twists, we're nearly done

Rinse them off and dry up too


They're clean, we're done good for you!

### **Tractors**


We must never get too close to a moving tractor. The farmer will not be able to see you or hear you. At the back, side and front of the tractor are the blind spots. That means you cannot be seen in these places.





Now draw a tractor of your own by joining the dots.


Don't forget to show the blind spots!



### Slurry & Water Safety


#### **Water Safety**

### Staying well and feeling well


Eating good food, exercise and wearing clothes to protect against the weather are important for everyone, not just farmers.
