# Fern Sefety Signs



Yellow means be careful, take care. You need to watch out for things out there!



These signs are warning signs to be careful or to watch out for something.

#### **Hand Signal:**



## Red means stop or danger's near, Don't go ahead stay clear, stay clear!



These signs are warning signs for danger or to stay away.



Green means it's safe , you're good to go. Green points the safe way when you need to know!



These signs are for us to follow. They tell us where we can go or what we can do.



## Blue is something you must do. When it's blue you have to!



These signs are signs for us to follow. They tell us things we must do.







## Safety in the sheds



Stay away from ladders and bales, pallets, tyres or anything else that you might find piled up on the farm.

Never try to play on these things on the farm.

#### **Safety Signs:**

#### Bales

Falling from stacks or loads is the biggest cause of injuries from bales.





Always be careful around bales!

### The Animal Pen



Farmers will keep animals indoors at different times of the year. In spring time many sheep and cattle are indoors as they prepare to give birth.

## Safety in the sheds



Be careful around animals in the sheds.

NEVER enter a pen with animals without an adult.

#### The Animal Pen



When animals have young, they can feel very protective.

Farmers must be careful and give them space to stay calm and safe.

## The Animal Pen

Did you know: Freshly calved cows can cause more accidents on farms than a bull!

### The Animal Pen Bulls



Bulls are very territorial, this means they protect their pen or their field and don't like anyone getting close to them.

NEVER enter a pen or field with a bull!

# The Animal Pen Medicines



Sometimes animals may need to be given medicine by the vet or farmer.


Farmers must store these medicines in a locked medicine press or cupboard.

NEVER touch any bottle that you see in a shed.

### Protect Yourself



Zoonosis is the spreading of disease from an animal to a person, handwashing can prevent the spread.

Wash your hands every time you are touch an animal.

#### **Protect Yourself**



Farmers set up footbaths to disinfect shoes and boots which prevent diseases spreading among their animals.

Always disinfect your shoes and boots when you enter or leave a farm.

## The Fields

Always make sure you have the farmers permission before you enter a field. You never know what could be inside.

NO TRESPASSING

If it was open when you got to it, leave it open.

If it was closed when you got to it, close it behind you.

It is never safe to climb over fences, or to go into fenced off areas. They are fenced off for a reason!

# The Fields Animals





NEVER enter a field without an adult.

NEVER run through a field of animals.

NEVER walk a dog or allow a dog to run free through a field of animals.



# The Fields Machinery



When farm machinery is in a field, farmers are usually busy working.

NEVER never go into a field when machinery is running. It can be dangerous.

# The Fields Water



Farms can have ditches, ponds, streams or rivers which can be slippery and dangerous.

Open water barrels or deep holes in the farmyard can also be unsafe, <u>ALWAYS</u> be careful where you walk.

Stay away from water so you don't fall in.

## Electricity

## Electricity

Farmers use electricity to help them with many jobs on the farm.

They need it for lights in the sheds, electric fences and clippers to shear sheep.



Always be careful around electricity!

## Electricity

Electricity also powers heaters to keep baby animals warm and machines in the dairy that help milk the cows.







Always be careful around electricity!

# Electricity Power Lines



Stay away from overhead cables and poles

Don't fly kites or use fishing rods near power lines

If a wire is on the ground, do not approach – call for help

## Electricity

KEY FARM SAFETY MESSAGES from ESB NETWORKS (ESBNetworks.ie)

- 1. Watch out for overhead electricity wires
- 2. Steer clear of electricity poles
- 3. Electricity wires are always live
- 4. Never touch fallen wires.
- 5. Never handle stock that may be in contact with electricity wires.
- 6. Display safety stickers on farm machinery to remind everyone to be "electricity safe".

# Electricity The Fields



Farmers use electric fences to keep their animals safely inside certain parts of the farm.

NEVER touch an electric fence!

#### Remember

A safe farm is a happy farm. Always think before you act!
