Have Fun and Learn - Summer Camp



he "Have Fun and Learn" summer camp for children aged 8–12 was successfully completed. The camp took place from 30 July 2025 to 13 August 2025 under the sponsorship of the *Center for Freedom and Justice* and was held at *Beit Ummar (Al-Arba'een) Park*.

The camp included many activities, most notably arts, theater, dabke (traditional dance), swimming, and various educational and recreational programs. A total of **70 children** (boys and girls) participated.

The children were divided into three groups based on their talents and skills as follows:

First Group - Dabke Group

Supervised by trainer *Lin Moqbel* with the assistance of volunteer *Lian Bahar*. This group included 25 boys and girls who acquired the following skills: (balance and correct posture, rhythm and counting skills, basic dabke steps, holding hands firmly, and self-confidence).



Second Group - Arts Group

Supervised by trainer *Alaa Bahar* and volunteer *Roz Alqam*. This group included 25 boys and girls who acquired the following skills: (drawing and coloring, handicrafts, observation and attention to detail, creativity and imaginative thinking, self-expression, focus and patience, and problem-solving skills).





Third Group - Theater Group

Supervised by trainer *Hamza Awad* with volunteers *Majd Moqbel* and *Lian Abragheeth*. This group included 20 boys and girls who acquired the following skills: (communication skills, self-confidence, teamwork, emotional expression skills, creativity and imagination, discipline and commitment, problem-solving skills, body and movement awareness, listening skills, and emotional endurance).





The camp was managed by *Murad Al-Salibi*, who oversaw the trainers to ensure proper implementation of activities, monitored the children, and coordinated their distribution into groups according to their talents to avoid conflicts between students. He also prepared daily breakfasts for the children, documented daily activities with photos, and prepared the summer camp reports.
