Thoroughbred racing is a major economic contributor and employer within Victoria. Its annual size, scope and participation numbers are dipicted.


























## RACING VICTORIA MEMBERSHIP

### CONFERENCE VENUE

Built on the banks of the Birrarung (Yarra River), the Melbourne Exhibition Centre (MCEC) was first opened in February 1996. Eight years later, the Victorian State Government announced the development of a new convention centre as part of a major development of the precinct. The project incorporated a commitment of \$370 million from the State Government and a further \$43 million from the City of Melbourne.

In 2009, the new Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre was officially unveiled, and that same year it became the first convention centre in the world to be awarded a six-star Green Star rating. In 2015, the Victorian State Government announced a \$205 million expansion of the MCEC, which was completed in July 2018. The expansion saw the event space increase by 25 per cent, taking its total size to 70,000 square metres. By 2019, the MCEC had exceeded \$1 billion in economic impact to the state of Victoria.

Affording stunning views of the city of Melbourne and its iconic Yarra River, the MCEC's Melbourne Room is the ideal location to host the 39th Asian Racing Conference Business Programme.

## RACE DAY: Black Caviar Lightning, Flemington Racecourse

Black Caviar Lightning Race Day is one of the headline meetings of Victoria's 2023 Festival of Racing featuring Group 1 action.

The marquee race is the Black Caviar Lightning, a Group 1 weight-for-age sprint run over 1000m at Flemington, one of the world's finest racetracks and home of the Melbourne Cup. The race is named in honour of Black Caviar, whose unbeaten record of 25 wins included three in the Lightning Stakes and a heart-stopping victory in the 2012 Diamond Jubilee Stakes at Royal Ascot.

The most recent winner of the Black Caviar Lightning was Home Affairs, under the 2021 Melbourne Cup-winning jockey James McDonald. The rollcall of Black Caviar Lightning champions also includes renowned Australian sprinters Choisir (2003), Takeover Target (2006), Miss Andretti (2007) and Scenic Blast (2009), who all went on to enjoy success in the King's Stand Stakes at Royal Ascot.

Held on Saturday 18 February 2023, Black Caviar Lightning Race Day will also showcase a broad range of off-track entertainment including live music, family-friendly fun and more.



## REGIONAL TOUR: Lindsay Park Racing and Mitchelton Winery

We are delighted to showcase regional Victoria's racing heartland, with a behind-the-scenes tour of one of the state's most picturesque and prestigious stables followed by lunch at an award-winning winery.

Lindsay Park's world-class stables, located in Euroa approximately 150km northeast of Melbourne, is a sprawling facility which was established by Australian Hall of Fame trainer, David Hayes. Today, with David training in Hong Kong, his two sons Ben and JD Hayes head up the family operation and continue the dynasty which was started by their late, great grandfather, Colin Hayes.

The Hayes brothers enjoyed an excellent season in 2021–22, finishing in the top three of the Victorian Trainers' Premiership and claiming their first Group 1 success together when Mr Brightside won the time-honoured Doncaster Handicap (1600m). The guided tour will offer visitors unprecedented access to the state-of-the-art training facilities as well as the chance to meet some of the stars of their stable, both equine and human.

The next stop is the nearby Mitchelton winery, which was purchased 10 years ago by leading Victorian businessman and racing fanatic Gerry Ryan, whose success as an owner included victory in the 2010 Melbourne Cup with Americain. Located on the banks of the picturesque Goulburn River, Mitchelton provides an idyllic setting to enjoy the estate's wide range of celebrated wines and the feature restaurant's gourmet food.
