Hello Everyone! Can you believe it is already July? Did you know that this year on July 4th, 2022 the Earth reaches its farthest point from the Sun, occurring about two weeks after the June solstice? This point in the Earth's orbit around the Sun is called "aphelion." We are closest to our fiery star in the winter and farthest away in the hot summer. This year, Earth will be 94,509,598 miles away from the Sun at aphelion.

The days have been hot. Please keep yourselves hydrated and do most of your outside work in the morning and even-

ing hours if you are able.

There has been a lot of great things happening in the town! I hope all who were able to come out to the collaborative GVFD Lawn Party and the

This year Council has decided to move forward with the First Responders Memorial at Town Hall. We are excited to finally have this in motion. As a tribute to our Former Chief of Police, John Painter, we will also be hosting our 1st ever, First Responders Ceremony, July 30th, 2022 at the GVFD from 4pm to 7pm. This will be an annual event to honor and pay tribute to our men and women, first responders, who serve and protect our community. In Honor of

Chief John Painter and Officer JJ Jefferson, who gave of their lives to save many, February 1st, 2022 at Bridgewater College.

Council and our town staff are working hard for you. With the recent budget adoption, Council voted to reduce the Real Estate Tax rate from .12 cents per \$100 of assessed value to .10 cents. This was to help offset the increase on taxes, due to the increase of assessed value for residential properties.

Town Manager's Message

Grottoes is a lovely town where citizens' sense of pride is evident by the abundance of neat and aesthetically

pleasing properties. The town is full of clean well-manicured lawns, beautiful landscaping with pops of bright colors, and houses kept in attractive, cared for conditions. From time to time we do see a few properties in town that could use some attention. The town

has ordinances that outline how properties should be cared for and what town staff and council can do to remedy any violations. These include town code Chapter 53 that defines inopera-

ble vehicles and details the notice and removal process; Chapter 117, which deals with nuisances such as, rubbish

and/or junk and Chapter 134 that addresses solid waste and weeds including grass over 8 inches. Also, town code Chapter 100 Table 1, explains all structure set-back regulations while Section 105 details fence regulations. Chapter 48 addresses the keeping of animals within Town. Additionally, the complete town code can be

found on our website under the Resources page.

Whenever a report of concern over these types of issues comes to the attention of staff, research must be done to determine if a violation according to code exists. Then the process of documenting the situation, notifying the responsible party, allowing time for violation remedy, determining financial costs and responsibility, and assuring violation compliance must happen. This is often a time-consuming process and must be done in a way that is economically feasible to the town and is defensible in court should it rise to that level. If you see a probable violation in town, please contact town hall or use the contact portion of our website to let us know.

During the hot days of summer remember to stay hydrated during outdoor activities. Also, remember to keep our furry companions hydrated. The Police Department has been receiving calls about dogs running loose or being walked while not on leashes. Please remember when your dog is not on your property they need to be on a leash and under control. If you have questions about the leash ordinance or questions

about dogs running at large, please do not hesitate to call the Police department. The full ordinance can be found under Chapter 48 of the Town Code.

Those dog owners that house their dogs outside remember that they need shelter from the elements such as shade from the sun and shelter from the cold. If you tether your dog it has to be 10 feet long or at least 3 times the animal's body length but not to be longer than 15 feet.
