

## Town Manager's Message

A top priority of our Council and staff, is to improve the town's aging water infrastructure. Through the receipt of federal money from the American Rescue Plan Act's State and Local Fiscal Recover Funds, we have been able to work on some much-needed water line replacement projects.

Most of the water service lines in town are 2 inches in diameter and made from galvanized steel and was put in place around the 1960s. Over time the steel will rust or become pitted, and leaks will occur. WE are focusing our funding and attention on areas where repeated leaks are known. One section of pipe along Aspen Avenue from 2nd Street to Grand Caverns Blvd, to Kellow Ave, is an area where leaks occur often and simultaneously. Therefore, work has been underway to replace that section of water line. Next on the list for replacement, and the addition of some fire hydrants, is along 7th Street from Birch Ave to Dogwood Ave, and also the 300 block of 13th Street.



As you see work in Town, please be aware that it may cause water service interruptions but that it will result in more reliable service and will improve the overall system.

## From the Chief's Desk..

Spring is here, and with the warmer months come the start of Lawn Mowing season. We at the police department receive a lot of complaints this time of year due to grass in the roadway. According to Virginia State Code 18.2-324, "nor shall any person throw or deposit or cause to be deposited upon any highway any soil, sand, mud, gravel or other substances so as to create a hazard to the traveling public." You can be with a charged Class 1 misdemeanor for leaving any substance that may cause a hazard on the roadway. In town we have a lot of citizens that ride bicycles and

motorcycles, grass in the roadway may cause the rider to wreck and be injured. Let's all do our part in keeping the roadways clear of grass clippings.

Officers with the Grottoes Police department have been contacting some home owners that have vehicles that are considered

"Inoperable vehicles" Some of the citizens may not know that we have a Town Ordinance that prohibits having these vehicles in plain view. According to the Town Ordinance Chapter 53 an inoperable vehicle is defined as follows:



**INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLE —**  
Any one or more of the following:

- A. Any motor vehicle which is not in operating condition;
- B. Any motor vehicle which for a period of 60 days or longer has been partially or totally disassembled by the removal of tires, wheels, the engine, or other essential parts required for operation of the vehicle; or
- C. Any motor vehicle on which there are displayed neither valid license plates nor a valid inspection decal.

starting at dusk! The big finale for the week will be our Cave Expo on Saturday, June 10<sup>th</sup>, from 12:00 pm – 4:00 pm. We'll have an obstacle course through the treetops to test your caving ability, crack your own 4 million year old geode (and take it home), build a bat box, and learn from a long list of our partners from across the region. ## Grottoes Volunteer Fire Department

### 1948 GVFD IN THE MAKING - REFLECTIONS OF 75 YEARS OF SERVICE

*Fourth in a series of articles preparing for GVFD 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration in 2023.*

Summer of 1948 was approaching and work on the one-bay fire station, on Aspen Avenue, was in full swing. Land and building materials were donated and many citizens helped in the construction, with GVFD president Bern Castle, supervising. In other preparations for fire service, the department divided the town into three fire zones. Then as arranged, Duplan boiler house employees, who worked 24/7, would answer the emergency fire calls for GVFD. After receiving a call, the siren at the factory would sound signals indicating the location of the fire. Also, a trip was made to Hahn Motor Company in Hamburg, PA, by several GVFD members, to check the progress of the anxiously awaited fire truck. Delivery was projected for midsummer 1948.

### Information from the Rockingham County Director of Elections

If you move/change your address, please remember to update your voter registration information. This is an easy process and may be accomplished when you renew your driver's license through DMV. Another convenient method for updating your information is online through this secure website: [vote.virginia.elections.gov](https://vote.virginia.elections.gov).

Elections are held every November, with the upcoming election being Tuesday, November 7. All polling locations are open from 6 AM – 7 PM on Election Day.

In Rockingham County, the **November 2023** ballot will include: Virginia Senate, Virginia House of Delegates (33<sup>rd</sup>, 34<sup>th</sup>, and 35<sup>th</sup> Districts), Constitutional Offices: Circuit Court Clerk, Commonwealth's Attorney, Commissioner of the Revenue, Sheriff, Treasurer; and, Board of Supervisors (Districts 2, 4 and 5), School Board (Districts 2, 4 and 5); Soil & Water Conservation District Directors (2 seats); Dayton Town Council (Special Election); and the Broadway Town election. In person or by mail absentee voting begins 45 days prior to every election. If you have questions, please contact the Rockingham County Voter Registrar's Office by calling 540-564-3055.

5. Your email address


