2024 Scholarship Awarded

For the twenty-second year in a row, the Brandermill Woods Foundation awarded a scholarship to a deserving team member. This year, the amount was increased to \$5,000 and split between two recipients. Additionally, two \$3,000 scholarships were donated by an anonymous resident who lives in Independent Living. This year, the Brandermill Woods Women's Club raised \$4,065 for a scholarship, for a total of five scholarships awarded.

The scholarship applications are anonymous with names removed from the application and from the supervisor's evaluation form. They are identified by number. Four Foundation Board members were on the committee: Pete Poli, Teresa Steinfatt, Tommy Baer and Robbin Kolbe. One resident representative from the Brandermill Woods Women's Club was also on the committee.

All five recipients were awarded their scholarships at the annual Foundation Cocktail Party on July 29.



One of this year's \$2,500 Foundation recipients was Edward Amoah who has worked as a CNA/Med Tech on the 11-7 shift in our Assisted Living community for 12 years. He is pursuing a Practical Nursing certification at Chesterfield Technical Center, with an anticipated graduation in 2026.
