WG1: Inducing a Second Life

The “multiple heritage” of derelict buildings provide a precious source for a larger urban transformation, which is launched by interventions that operate first on the scale of the site itself, integrating social and cultural traces in the sites' geographical and physical rehabilitation and enables an upscaling of the transformation's impact. It can induce a second life whose urban energy radiates far beyond its physical limits.

WG2: Creating New Urban Relationships

A missing layer of urbanity is added on a territory with underlying complexities. In all these large sites, the question is how to inhabit them, how to relate to them, and how to add a human ecosystem while negotiating the pros and cons of the existing complexity. It may involve rethinking interrupted urban developments, healing the scars left or created by old and new infrastructures, regenerating sub-standard housing or brownfield sites, and reconsidering rivers or former agricultural lands.

Within this family of sites, the potential of soils can guide the evolution of a place through processes of regeneration, intensification, or transformation. The biological dimension of available land can foster new ecological and social relationships, enabling interactions between organisms for mutual benefit. From the horizon to the scale of microorganisms, what is the capacity of soils to sustain biodiversity, provide ecosystem services, and ensure continuity across the territory?

WG6: Regenerating Landscapes

How can we design processes and projects for the revaluation of landscapes that emphasise the interdependencies and eco-dependencies of resources (natural, cultural, productive) and their territories? Landscape regeneration can serve as a tool of mediation between residential areas, facilities, obsolete infrastructures, and territories undergoing transformation (or even at risk) due to the effects of climate change. It is an invitation to reconsider local resources in a regenerative way, supporting a healthier environment for both humans and non-humans.

LISBON VISITS & PROJECTS-PROCESSES

LECTURE 2 “LISBON RESOURCED” + URBAN/ARCHITECTURAL VISITS

Lisbon has been making an effort to ‘future-proof’ the city. Given Portugal’s recent experiences with prolonged and severe droughts, its Wastewater Reuse Plan aims to use over 1 million cubic metres of recycled wastewater by 2030 to irrigate urban parks.

Guaranteeing reliable water distribution is a key investment opportunity for Lisbon in the coming years.

Another important initiative is the CHOOSE TO EVOLVE: 2030 measures for 2030 campaign, which aims to adopt a new urban model for institutions, businesses and public bodies focused on mitigating climate change? It includes measures such as eliminating single-use plastics, installing solar energy equipment and providing employees with sustainable mobility solutions. So far, over 200 institutions, businesses and public bodies have committed to concrete actions that will further the city’s green objectives.

BUS 1: Social re-sourcing

A trip into the city transformation processes with local engagement (business-as-usual, leading to community engagement and temporary uses). Sites visits of Jardim de Torrel and Hospital Miguel Bombarda.

BUS 2: Urban re-sourcing

A walk along the riverfront regeneration of Beato southeast Lisbon waterfront, focuses on the urban transformation processes of old industrial fabric and the creation of start up economies. *These are routes where the walking level is intense (6-7 kilometers)*

BUS 3: Housing re-sourcing

A visit of most recent affordable housing projects managed by the municipal urban rehabilitation agency SRU. They are in final stage of execution. Site visit of the housing project in Vale Fundão, Marvila.

BUS 4: Natural re-sourcing

A visit to recently finished green/blue infrastructures - parks in Lisbon dealing with climate change and renaturalisation, as part of the expansion of qualitative public space structure in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area. Site visit of Frente Ribeirinha do Tejo, Praia dos Pescadores to the military base of Alverca, Póvoa de Santa Iria and Alverca.

BUS 5: Material/Construction re-sourcing

A visit of buildings around Bairro de Boavista, conceptualized within the notion of maximum material/construction reuse, with social re-sourcing dimension: Edifício 4, ISCTE and Mosteiro Santos-Novo.

LECTURE 3: ARCHITECTURE OF REUSE

EUROPEAN PROJECTS-PROCESSES

European created a digital platform to showcase 50 projects—processes from recent sessions—analyzed and compared to build knowledge about the post-competition phase, when a winning idea evolves into a production process across different scales. On the occasion of the forum, several emblematic processes are presented and become objects of a debate with the site representatives of E18 who will be engaged after the competition in a diversity of processes of implementation.

How to pass from winning ideas to processes of implementation?

A presentation and discussion about recent and emblematic European project-processes in European will be launched by a keynote speech of Kristiaan Borret (former Bouwmeester of the Brussels Capital Region) about urban transformation and reusing practices in Brussels during last decade. A total of eight implementation processes from European 10 to European 16 will be presented and compared in an open discussion focused on two different levels: the strategic and the operational level. Also several sites from European 18 will be connected with these processes, as having similar potentials, to learn together how ideas can be transformed in realities, involving site representatives of E18.

Kristiaan Borret will take on the role of Grand Témoin in the discussion.
