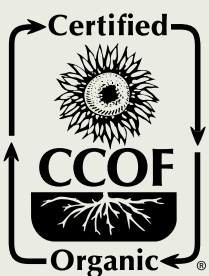

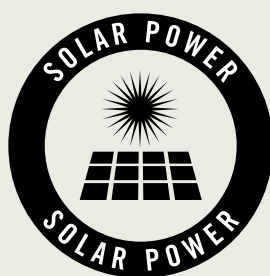

ANDREW is rooted in a CCOF certified organic vineyard in Paso Robles, where grapes are grown with care and without synthetic chemicals. This commitment to the land ensures each harvest reflects the vineyard's natural character, creating wines with purity and

ANDREW's vineyard in Paso Robles is SIP Certified, meeting rigorous standards for sustainability. This certification protects people, planet, and prosperity, ensuring responsible farming and winemaking for generations to come.



THE LAND

ANDREW comes from a single, sustainably farmed vineyard in Paso Robles, known for its deep commitment to organic and regenerative farming. As one of the first vineyards in the region to fully embrace sustainability, it utilizes cover crops, composting, and wildlife corridors to maintain a thriving ecosystem. Combined with award-winning winemaking, this approach ensures wines that are pure, expressive, and ethically made, honoring both the land and those who cultivate it.



PHILIP ZORN / Wine-maker

Philip was the winemaker at Sunny St. Helena Winery, Gauer Estate in Sonoma, Mountain View Vintners, and Paraiso Springs in Monterey, gaining experience with grapes grown in several regions. In 1998, Philip ventured out on his own and by 2000 had established his own Waterstone brand with a business partner, a label he eventually sold in 2017.

Philip's philosophy as a winemaker is to let the vineyard speak for the wines. He avoids interfering with the expression of terroir and is careful to ensure that overlays like oak for example, do not overshadow the expression of the fruit.
