

Cervical Cancer in Wisconsin | January 2026

Cervical cancer impacts **6.1 in 100,000** women in Wisconsin each year. Between 2018-2022, over **900** women were diagnosed with cervical cancer.



★ WHY THIS MATTERS

Cervical cancer is largely preventable through immunization and routine screening.

Cervical cancer most often impacts women when they are most active in the workforce and in raising their families, resulting in significant social and economic impacts.

Statewide Improvement Goal: 15,000 more patients screened for cervical cancer

Improve access to cervical cancer screenings

Increase HPV vaccination rates

Focus on disproportionately impacted communities including racial and ethnic minorities and urban underserved communities

CERVICAL CANCER QUALITY IMPROVEMENT RESULTS

Improving Prevention and Screening for Cervical Cancer

- Compared to 2016, **10,767** more patients were vaccinated for HPV in 2025
- 3,835** more patients screened for cervical cancer in 2025 compared to 2022

By improving HPV vaccination rates, Wisconsinites can prevent 9 in 10 cases of cervical cancer.

Improving cervical cancer screening rates allows treatment in early stages of disease when prognosis is best.
